 August Begins strong wind from the Lat 34.15
 5th 1839 South Ship steering 'W' 24 Long 22.9
 by the Wind At 7 AM both to the
 18 by E latter part much the same. Thus Ends
 Lat 3.16

August Begins strong Wind from Lat 33.3
 6th 1839 The South Ship a new
 Main top sail and all close
 Top sail Middle light sails
 At 5 PM part of ship steering
 To the Southwest but English Calves
 At 12 the ship to the W. S.
 Ends much the same

August 7th 1839 Begins strong wind from Lat 3.51
 The South W by S set
 of ship to the South West
 And latter much the same
 Thus Ends

August 8th 1839 Begins strong Wind from Lat 3.47
 From the South Ship Long 22.52
 Ends SE at 8 PM the
 Wind north of E by S
 Take ship heading
 S W Middle and latter
 Much the same

August 9th 1839 Begins light Wind from Lat 3.57
 The Southern Ship heading
 at 7 PM take ship
 several ships in sight
 North and latter much the
 same Thus Ends

From Cape and Island Towards Kirkland
 August 10th 1839 Begins strong Wind from the Lat 33.3
 SE by S and sail in sight
 North and latter much the
 same Thus Ends

August 11th 1839 Begins strong wind from Lat 28.1
 The Southern Ship heading
 SE by S and sail in sight
 Ends much the same

August 12th 1839 Begins light wind from Lat 4.5.3
 The Southern Ship heading
 W S W same two sails steady
 To the Westward at 5 PM
 we take to the SE the
 Wind north of SE by E
 At 9 like to the Westward
 Ends much the same

August 13th 1839 Begins light wind from the Lat 14
 Southern ship heading 'W S W' much of the
 The Watch Employed in ships
 Duty Middle and latter strong
 Wind ship heading S W So Ends
 Sited a ship to the windward steering 'W'

August 14th 1839 Begins strong Wind from the Lat 2.00
 Southern and Eastern ship heading South
 S W by S Middle part the wind Long 24.57
 more to the East the ship heading
 SE W latter much the same
 Thus Ends
