

Remarks On Board The Jasper

August 22th 1839 Begins light winds from the Lat 17-40 South and squalls of rain. Wind calm in the night and light. The wind later more moderate from N.E. to E. and

August 23rd 1839 Begins light winds from the Lat 19-41. Ship steering S.W. at 1 P.M. and later on at standing sail at 3 P.M. later in the evening sails the wind shifted E by S. Later Part light. Wind went fine weather.

August 24th 1839 Begins light winds from E by S Lat 21-29. Ship steering S.W. by the wind Long 25-25. At 1 P.M. saw sperm whales going to the rightward and later fine weather. Thus ends.

August 25th 1839 Begins light winds from E by S Lat 23-27. Ship heading S by E. Men employed in fitting, rigging and other jobs. Ends much the same.

August 26th 1839 Begins light winds from E by S Lat 24-25. Ship heading S by E with all sail set at 11 A.M. Steady. Ends fine weather and light winds.

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August 27th 1839 Begins light winds from E Lat 25-31. Ship steering S by S with all sail set. Later light winds.

August 28th 1839 Begins light winds from W Lat 26-31. Ship steering S.W. at 5 P.M. the wind shifted out of W. Ship had over the foremast sails steering. At 5 A.M. the wind shifted out of W. and later in the evening sails. Ship heading E by E. Wind to pour. Rainy. Ends strong winds and overcast weather. Thus ends.

August 29th 1839 Begins strong winds from E by S. Ship heading E by S and overcast. The wind and later thick overcast weather and squalls of rain. Ship heading S.W. to E.

August 30th 1839 Begins strong winds from E Lat 27-31. Ship S.W. and thick overcast Long 26-41. At 5 P.M. the wind shifted to the North. Ship steering S.W. Took in fore and main topsails and mainmast and double reefed. The fore topmast at daylight and all said the wind from the Westward. Thus ends.
