

Remarks On Board The Bark Jasper

November 3th 1839 Begins light wind from SSW and fine weather men employed in stowing down at 12 AM finished stowing down at sunset shortened sail cut the watch boat at day light inside all east side fine weather Lat 34-33 Long 105-00

November 4th 1839 Begins light wind from WSW ship having light sail and small fishback at 4 PM saw a right whale bore the boat the

to the ship cut the watch boat L Boat crew at day light commenced cutting at 10 AM saw a whale bore the L Boat crew and struck and struck and struck the whale at 11 AM finished cutting and started the watch boat to East

November 5th 1839 commenced with strong winds from SSW but the same

November 6th 1839 Begins strong wind from SSW men employed in long haul latter part more moderate to East Lat 34-22 Long 105-07

November 7th 1839 Begins strong wind from the SSW employed in hauling at sunset shortened sail Middle more moderate at 6 AM commenced stowing down at 8 AM worked down the works Ends fine weather Lat 34-29 Long 105-05

On Whal Ground

November 8th 1839 Begins light wind from SSW and fine weather men employed in stowing down oil at 12 AM finished stowing down at sunset shortened sail cut the watch boat at day light inside all east side fine weather Lat 35-42

November 9th 1839 Begins light wind from SSW and fine weather nothing in sight saw the two boats cutting a sperm whale at sunset shortened sail middle part light squalls at day light made sail Ends strong wind

November 10th 1839 Begins strong wind from SSW ship heading to the eastward Middle and latter squalls of rain to East Lat 35-00 Long 105-50

November 11th 1839 Begins strong wind from SSW and heavy at sunset shortened sail Middle more moderate latter fine weather to East Lat 35-15 Long 105-27 by lunar

November 12th 1839 Begins light wind from WSW and fine weather nothing in sight at sunset shortened sail cut the watch boat crew at daylight made sail heavy weather Lat 35-00 Long 105-27 by lunar

November 13th 1839 Begins strong wind from the south at sunset shortened sail spoke the two boats at daylight made sail Ends fine weather Lat 35-48 Long 107-43
