December 3rd 1839 Begins strong winds from the
south ship heading north Employed
in hauling Ends the same
Lat 38-14 Long 114-49

December 4th 1839 Begins light winds from N. E. ship
heading East by long sight
Eight whals bred and chased without
success Middle and latter Part strong
winds so Ends Lat 38-14

December 5th 1839 Begins strong winds from the N. W.
ship steering to the S. W. by long
at 12 got through hauling latter
employed in stowing down
Lat 38-33 Long 105-10

December 6th 1839 Begins light winds from N. E. ship
heading to the N. E. Employed
in stowing down Ends much the same
Lat 38-27 Long 105-05

December 7th 1839 Begins light winds from N. E. ship
heading to the north all hands Employed
in mashing ship Middle part from
Ends strong gales and squally
spoke the Maria From timore bound
to Sydney Lat 38-12 Long 105-12

December 8th 1839 Begins strong winds from West steering
N. E. more Employed in securing boat masting
in sight Ends strong winds
Lat 37-18 Long 106-14 East

On Whale ground 21
December 9th 1839 Begins strong winds from the West
ship steering N. E. all sail set Ends
much the same Lat 38-19

December 10th 1839 Begins strong winds from N. W. ship
steering N. E. all sail set Ends much
the same Lat 38-30 Long 108-28

December 11th 1839 Begins light winds from N. E. ship
heading to the S. E. more Employed in
hauling down Ends much as the first
Lat 38-55 Long 108-59

December 12th 1839 Begins light winds from N. W. ship
steering S. E. Middle much the same latter
Part strong winds and squally

December 13th 1839 Begins strong winds from the south ship
heading N. E. latter strong gales S. W.
ship heading to the S. E. Lat 39-15 Long 113-34

December 14th 1839 Begins strong winds from N. W. ship
ship steering N. E. all sail set Middle
much the same latter more moderate
saw a right whale bore the boat took
on to the ship before the observation
L. Boat

December 15th 1839 Begins strong winds and squally from
the West Employed in masting and
and latter Part strong gales from S. W.
ship heading East by long sight the ship
bore south of our yard Capt. Russell
