

Remarks On Board The Faguer

Saturday May 15th 1840

Begins pleasant breeze and fine from S E
Steering N W by E the watch Employed
in ships duty spoke the bark new haven of
New-haven Capt down bound to Barbados
Lat 24-22 Long 58-05

Sunday May 16th 1840

Begins light winds and pleasant from
South
Steering N W by E Middle part Calms
with light squalls of rain latter part
light wind from S E Ends
Lat 23-09 Long 58-48

Monday May 18th 1840

Begins light winds from S E and pleasant
Steering N W by E at 4 P M pump
Ship taking 20 strokes an hour
Middle part strong winds Ends fine
Lat 25-10 Long 58-13 W

Tuesday May 19th 1840

Begins breeze from E by S and fine weather
Steering N W by E Men Employed in
ships duty one sail in sight latter
part fine Employed in hunting the whale
Lat 28-53 Long 60-12

Wednesday May 20th 1840

Begins pleasant from E by E steering N W
men Employed in ships duty latter the same
Lat 28-53 Long 61-20

Thursday May 21st 1840

Begins fine breeze from E by E steering
N W by E Middle the same lat winds
from the south lat 28-31
Long by Chron 61-28 Long by Lunar 61-02

August Saturday 15th 1840

This voyage commences with light winds
From the Northward at 10 A M took pilot and
got under way Ends the same

August Sunday 15th 1840

Begins light winds from the south
at sunset came to in the bay at day
light got under way and went out
at 10 A M pilot left us

Monday 17th 1840

Begins strong winds from the east
Ship heading S E by E Employed in fitting
the boat &c

Tuesday August 18th 1840

Begins strong winds from the East
Employed in ships duty, &c

Wednesday August 19th 1840

Begins strong winds from E by E ship
heading S E by E double reefed our topsails
Middle much the same latter part moderate
brook out the reef. So Ends

Thursday August 20th 1840

Begins strong winds from the S by W ship
heading E by S by the wind latter much the same

Friday August 21st 1840

Begins strong breeze from Northward and mottled
Employed in fitting the rigging sighted several
sail So Ends
