

Remarks On Board the *Phaedis*

Thursday Nov 12th 1840

Begins with light winds from S & W ship
steering S & E So Ends

Friday Nov 13th 1840

Begins light winds from E ship
heading S & E latter part wind from
S & E ship heading S & E Ends fine weather

Saturday Nov 14th 1840

Begins light winds from N & E and
fine weather ship steering S & E at 9
AM raised two right whales bore the
boats but without success the whales
were bound to the Western

Sunday Nov 15th

Begins light winds from the S & E
Ship steering of the same whales
at 2 1/2 PM bore the boats could not
get one came on board and kept of
by S Ends much the same Lat 35° 24'

Monday November 16th

Begins with light winds from
N & W ship steering E by S
A sail in sight a head latter part
strong winds from W at 10 AM saw
small whales bore the boat the barrow
struck and gut stove and lost the
whale So Ends

Friday November 27th 1840

Begins strong gales from the W & N
Ship steering E & E middle part more moderate
Ship steering the same middle part made
all sail latter part fine weather & sail in sight
steering to the Eastern Lat 38° 30' Long 25° 59'

Saturday Nov 28th 1840

Begins light winds from the S & W ship
steering S & E by E Ends much the same

Sunday Nov 29th 1840

Begins strong winds from the Western
and East middle part strong gales
and accompanied with rain So Ends

Monday Nov 30th 1840

Begins strong winds from Eastern
middle part strong gales from the S & E
latter strong gales from W heading S
So Ends

Tuesday December 1st 1840

Begins heavy gale from the W ship
heading S latter more moderate made all
sail steering S & E Lat 39° 07' Long 32° 27'

Wednesday December 2nd 1840

Begins strong breeze from N & W ship
steering S & E by E Fine weather So Ends

Thursday December 3rd 1840

Begins fine breeze from the N ship
steering S & E latter strong winds double reef
sails took in fore and main sail
Lat 39° 30' Long 37° 35'
