

Friday December 4th 1840
 L B Begins strong winds from the N ship
 steering S E more moderate a sail
 In sight at daylight made all sail
 at 8 AM sighted night whale bred the
 boats the starboard boat struck took one
 to the ship the barboard boat struck
 gut foul line and cut the End Lat 40° 00

Saturday December 5th 1840
 Begins light winds from E and rising
 W B employed in cutting many whales in
 sight at 11 AM saw whale bred took
 one to the ship Ends fine weather
 Employed in haying no observation

Sunday December 6th 1840
 Begins light winds and fine weather
 L B Employed in cutting at sunset gut three
 cutting commenced haying at 8 AM set
 whale bred the boats barboard to
 the ship Ends fine the wind S E
 Lat 39° 40 Long 39° 15

Monday December 7th 1840
 Begins light winds from the
 North and East Employed in
 cutting at 4 PM finished cutting
 commenced haying saw a ship standing
 to the West at 11 AM saw
 whale bred the boats and galed the whale
 Employed in haying So Ends

On Whale Ground
 Thursday Dec 17th 1840
 Begins strong winds the West
 Ship steering S at 5 AM saw
 an island of ice to the West ship
 steering S by E So Ends Lat 43° 29 Long 44° 58

Friday Dec 18th 1840
 Begins strong winds from the West
 Ship steering S by E Wind and latter
 part foggy under light sail So Ends

Saturday Dec 19th 1840
 Begins light winds from the North
 at sunset shortened sail set the watch
 boat crew and foggy at daylight
 made all sail Ends foggy
 Lat 42° 44 Long 47° 30

Sunday 20th 1840
 Begins light winds from the N
 saw Right whales bred the boats
 did not strike came on board
 set more whales bred the boats
 did not strike saw two islands
 of ice at sunset shortened sail set
 the watch boat crew So Ends

Monday Dec 21st 1840
 Begins strong breeze from the N
 ship to the E at 3 PM double reefed
 the topsails at sunset took in sail
 set the watch boat crew at daylight
 made all sail So Ends
 Lat 32° 51 Long 31° 14
