Monday Feb 8th 1841

Begins light winds from the S W.
Ship steering S & E. End strong
gale from the W. steering E

Tuesday Feb 9th 1841

~~Begin strong~~ Begins strong gales
from the W. ship steering E
at 2 P.M. luffed to at 8 A.M.
steering E strong gales from S W.
latter moderate so End lat 47° 5' Long 147° E

Wednesday Feb 10th 1841

Begins light winds from the S W.
and a heavy sea ship steering E
End strong winds from the W.

Thursday Feb 11th 1841

Begins strong gales from the W. ship
steering E & E at 8 P.M. luffed to middle
part strong gales latter strong gales
steering E more moderate so End
lat 38° 10' Long 151° 48'

Friday Feb 12th 1841

Begins light winds from the W.
ship steering E & E. End much
the same.

Sunday Feb 21st 1841

Begins strong gales from the S W.
Middle part strong gales W.
End strong gales going to under
close reefed main top sail

Monday Feb 22nd 1841

Begins strong gales from the W.
End strong gales from S going to
under close reefed main top sail

Tuesday Feb 23rd 1841

Begins strong gales from the S
going to under close reefed main
top sail middle more moderate
latter strong gales from the S & E

Wednesday Feb 24th 1841

Begins strong gales from the S
middle part the same latter more
moderate so End lat 49° 36' Long 153° 20'

Thursday Feb 25th 1841

Begins strong winds from the S W.
at 4 P.M. saw whales fore the
boats did not strike latter part strong
winds from the S W. lat 50° 14' Long 157° 42'

Friday Feb 26th 1841

Begins strong winds from the
S W. ship heading S W. E. so End
lat 50° 01' Long 165° 45'
