Thursday 1st Commenced with strong Gale from
the Westward Steering S. I. C. all sail out
saw a sail to the Westward Steering S. by E. & E
they land Lat 37:44 Long 76:35

Thursday 2^d Commences with Light Breezes from
the Northward steering to the E by N.E.
all sail out put out the S.B. they 11 PM

all sail
St 37 46 76 35

Saw the Head of Amudarya, heading
S.E. Dist - 10 miles at 5 AM sent
in the L.B. & W.B. saw a sail
No. 14

Saturday 3d Commenced with Breeze
from the NW lying off and on the Land
the Ship, Salmoit of Sagharbony and
Coserio of N B 180th 20 wholy 11 mi. at
the other 7 mi. 70th at 4 PM Boat came
on Board saw 3 wholy very wild went fishing
with S B got a plunk. Latter part strong gale
lying too under Storm Sails then ended

Sunday 4th Commences with heavy gale from the N N E Lying under storm-sail latter part wind from the W S W then Ery with very heavy squalls the Land-bearings West Dist 20 miles

Lat 3743. " Long 101° 05' W
Monday, 5th Commenced with strong gales
from the W. S. W. headed South under storm
sails with very heavy squalls. Lat 21° 25' N
25 miles bearing N. E. West this day.

air and Squally head to the Northward & Star
Several fire backs, but no Whales Employed at rising
got a jawing for saying that I had a

in the Ship is a Carpenter Shop Sail Loft
and a caulker Shop and every thing but a
Ship saying for a voyage I never said it with
a man that ever tried so hard to make
every thing go so hard for his Officer & 28th
crew no fancying allowed no singing playing
No game nor nothing to pass away so long
and hard a voyage & 1st 11th 22nd 10
