

Bark Unions Bound to the

1848

Monday 24th April 1848 Commences with Light breezes from the Eastward head N N E all sail out Middle & Latter part many squalls of Wind & rain with lightning that ends Lat 10 09 Long 171 40

25th Commences with strong breezes & squally with rain from the Eastward head N E by N at 1 PM carried away main top sail yard Employed at fitting another out of a fly gill boom Latter part sent it up at Day Light saw the Land Isles of the Duke of Clarence bearing N by East Dist 10 9.17 South miles this 24 hours have had very long & variety of Weather Wind from N N E 171 38 to S E

26th Commences with gusty weather from the Eastward Don opposite Jack under the lee of the Land Capt mending a boat that got stove in the hurricane those that like a variety ought to come to sea they land the Land in sight Dist 10 miles Lat 9 28 Long 171 25

27th Commences with Light breezes from the E by South head N E by E. Employed at various jobs saw porpoise the Land off our weather bow Dist 6 miles Middle & part & Latter part ends with squally with lightning & thunder Lat 8 28 Long 170 40

28th Commences with strong breezes & squally from the Eastward head from N N E to E N E by the round saw nothing in sight but fish Employed at various jobs Latter part standing S on the Wind

29th Commences with Light pleasant weather from E N E standing S E by the Wind got out the S B Middle part much lightning Latter part much the same Lat 9 09 South Long 170 00 55

30th Commences with Light breezes from the E N E head on opposite Jack Employed at various jobs Middle part squally thus ends this day Lat 8 19 10 45 Lat

May 1st 1848 Commences with Light pleasant breezes from the E N E head Middle & Latter part much the same Lat 8 25 Long 169 21
