Thursday 5th 1848

Commenced with strong breezes from the S.W.
head S.E. Middle & Latter part the
same head Northward this day
No by this day

Friday 6th 1848

Commenced with squally from various
parts head in shore to the North
Middle & Latter part the same

Lat 8.48 Long 84.58
Saturday 7th 1848

Commenced with brisk breeze & squally
with rain at 1 P.M. put away to
93 the South steering S.E. hauled to
Capt. the wind at dark head South
they End squally
Caught 4 Dolphin Lat 7.40 Long 84.00
1 turtle

30 Leather jackets Sunday 8th 1848

Commenced with squally weather &
thunder & lightning very rainy
Middle part wind headed her off
to S.E. Tacked ship to S.W. the wind
hauled back & tacked to the S.E.
Latter part strong breezes from
S.W. to S.W. all sail out
they End there 24 hours

off Cape Blanco Chester D. Smith
in Oct 1848

Monday 9th 1848

Commenced with fine pleasant weather & brisk
breezes from the S.W. various some 2 points
for each way head from South to S.E. at
Boatstern Dark took in mainsail fly jill Main top
Lost his Gallant sail 1 reef in fore top sail Middle
part rainy & squally Latter part the same
Lat 5.08 Long 82.50

Tuesday 10th 1848

Commenced with fine pleasant showers
Caught from the South West by head South West
on Easterly Mettle part the same
thence Latter part rainy

Lat 4.08 Long 82.28

Wednesday 11th 1848

Commenced with strong breezes from the
S.W. heading S.E. all sail out Middle
& Latter part the same

Lat 3.50 Long 80.50

Thursday 12th 1848

Commenced with strong breezes from
the S.W. heading S.E. all sail out
Middle & Latter part the same (Kiss)
End heading W.S. Lat 2.30 Long 81.05

Friday 13th 1848

Commenced with strong breezes on opposite
Tacks Wind South Middle & Latter
the same Lat 2.00 Long 80.40
