

Remarks on Board Bark *Cumey*
Jan 1849

Monday 1st Day of January 1849..

Commenced with light breeze from the south
Round the Coast in sight of Land saw 1 seal
this day

Jan 8th 1849
came to anchor at Point de La Gelare
to procure wood and water & fruit
Discharged the look here

Jan 12th
took our anchor and proceeded down
to Tacamay to ship men succeeded
in shipping 1 & stealing away 3.

Tuesday 13 took our anchor and went
to sea steering East past An American
steamer steering West

Lat 12° 2' Long 80° 40'
Monday 14th 1849
strong breeze from the S.W. headed
west

Tuesday 23

saw the Islands of Borinquen Potosi
guinea, Sincany, Anilow, Abington, Alhumbal
this day

Round Eastward in 1849

Thursday 15th 1849
Forepart strong squally from the E.S.E. head
N.E. Middle part took in all but
Double reef Fore & main Top sail & fore
sail blowing strong at latter part the
same No ob

Friday 16th 1849
Forepart more moderate wind at all points
Course E. Middle & latter part the same
this day No ob this day

Saturday 17th 1849
Fore part light breeze & rising wind
from the Wainoy quarter, Course East
at 7 AM saw a school of sp. Whales
Lowered & struck 1. 80th whale
& drewed this day this day

Sunday 18th 1849
Forepart light breeze & squally body still
after the whale at 3 PM S.B. struck a
gibbon whale & drewed at dark came
on board took up the boat wishing for
better luck next time
at Day Light saw a
School of Whales Lowered all
3 boats W.B. struck a large whale
& at 10 took him to the
ship & commenced cutting
this day this day

Saw Whales

Lat 21° 00' N Long 103° 22'

Monday strong breeze employed cutting
finished & began to boil this
day squally
