in my opinion for he is a man of God &
the whole ship company know it & other
ship company too.

Sept 23^d 1849 This day the old man told me
to have the deck washed off where the Officers
had been & I told my Mace & went down
When I came down he began on me and
wanted to know if I done as he told me
I replied it was my Loft & that I told Mr
Mace he answered that the Loft and to
do as he told me I told him I was not the
only one that went there & that anything
would do to find fault with me for
that he said do as you ought to
I told him that I had tried to please
him all the voyage & you know it
& the more I tried the more I
came from it & that I wanted was good
usage from him & that I had not had
it for the last 2 months

To end this day
Oct 15th 1849 This day the Steward
told the Capt that I had drawn
the out of a barrel aft that
Mr Chearston & Mace had filled
up so the old man enquired of
the foremast hand if I had a
bye barrel and at night I went
down below & was gone 10 minutes
the Capt asked Mr Mace if he had
given a wash below after 4 o'clock
he said no then don't call them
forward nor aft so he went and
told a foremast hand to do my
duty I have not been below all
day to stop 3 minutes before
except meal time

Monday 19th Commenced with all hand
the Capt says they eat so much that he
will keep them to work he is a Christian
so he thinks I would to God I could think
so too we have not got much oil but
whos fault is it off St. Marys Bank we
saw sperm whaly 3 days running & he
would not stop there for fear he should
have a gale then we went to St. Pauls
2000 miles & staid a few days sent the boat
off once & saw several whales & then had
a gale & he left there then on New Holland
2000 saw sperm whaly 3 days running in
the Latitude of from 28th to 30th Long
109th to 116th & carried all sail to get
away for fear we would blow 3 times we
have been almost across the Indian Ocean
& never got a whale with studding sail
Set Night & day & who wonders we don't
get a voyage I come here for a voyage
but it looks discouraging & if there was
any place would be better but no to find
fault all the time I don't believe there is
a man in the ship that would put
out his hand to save his life I would
not if we see whaly he will whalit with
his old hat untill they get galled &
then say it to his Officers & that is the
way the voyage is going on I wish
I was out of her if it was an
a desert Island & the other officers too
he is the most disagreeable man I ever
saw and the most ignorant Capt I
ever sailed with & he thinks he knows
more than all the rest of the master on
the coast & he is the laughing stock of
the whole New Holland fleet & the whole
ship company hate him with a deadly hatred
if the mate had had the ship we should had
