Sunday October the 1st
Commences fresh winds from North steering
S. S. W. at 4 P. M. the Long. by Chron. 19. 09 W.
at 5 P. M. took in the Light Sails, and hauled
up the Coures, at 7 have too to the Eastward
at 11. tacked to the West at 3 to East at 6 A. M.
Foggy in light bearing E. distant 3 Leagues
Strong gales from N. N. E. running along the
South side of Rico and Fayall.

Monday October the 2nd
Commences strong gales from N. E. under
double reefed Top Sails heading S. E. by E.
for St. Michaels, winds very shifting at 6
P. M. the E. point of Rico North 6 Leagues
dist. strong gales through the night, under
double reefed Top Sails, at 1 P. M. more to
the West. at 6 to the East heading E. S. E.
Lat. by Obs. 38. 14 N.

Tuesday October the 3rd
Commences strong gales from North under
double reefed Top Sails, steered E. S. E. until
3 P. M. have too heading E. N. E. at 4 P. M.
Long. by Chron. 16. 11 W. at 7 more ship to W.
thick weather, Middle and Latter part much
the same. Lat. by Obs. 37. 14 N.

Wednesday October the 4th
Commences with strong winds from N. E.
at 1 P. M. more to the Eastward, Long. by
Chron. at 4 P. M. 16. 55. West. Middle part
heavy squalls of wind and rain, at 6 A. M.
saw the West. End of St. Michaels bearing
E. S. E. dist. 5 Leagues, Strong winds and
rain. Lat. by Obs. 36. 00

from Fair Haven to the Azores

Thursday October the 8th
Commences fresh winds and rising weather
from North, at 3 P. M. cleared up, made all sail
steering S. E. by S. for the Port of Delgada
at 4 P. M. Long. by Chron. 15. 59. W. Middle
and Latter parts much the same.

Friday October the 9th
Commences strong winds from N. E.
lying off and on at St. Michaels, at 7 P. M.
went on shore for recruits, at noon returned
with every thing on board, and ^{made} sail
steering S. S. West.

Saturday October the 10th
Commences with light winds and pleasant
weather from E. S. E. steering S. S. W. at 6
P. M. St. Michaels bore S. E. Middle
and Latter part fresh winds steering
S. by W. Lat. by Obs. 35. 34 N.

Sunday October the 11th
Commences fresh winds from N. E. steering
S. S. W. at 4 P. M. Long. by Chron. 14. 23. W.
Middle and Latter parts strong winds and
ragged weather, with rain, Lat. by Obs. 34. 38

Monday October the 12th
Commences fresh winds from N. E. steering
S. S. W. at 4 P. M. Long. by Chron. 14. 14 W.
at 6 P. M. took in the Light Sails and single
reefed the Top Sails, Middle and Latter parts
the same steering S. S. W. Lat. by Obs. 33. 52 N.
