Sunday November the 1st
Commences with heavy squalls of wind
and rain from the Eastward, at 1 P.M.
saw a sail to the leeward, heading to the
Southward, when it rains, at this
moment, Middle and Latter parts light winds
from E. to S.E. heading from S. by E. to S.W.
2 Ships in sight Lat. by Obs 8° 25' N.
Long. by Chron 112° 18' 45" W.

Monday November the 2nd
Commences light breezes and clear weather
winds from S.E. to E.S.E. heading from
S.W. to South under all sail Middle
and Latter parts much the same, employed
in Ships duty Lat. by Obs 8° 24' N.
Long. by Chron 112° 06' 45" W.

Tuesday November the 3rd
Commences with light winds from S.E.
heading S.W. under all sail 3 Ships
in sight heading to the Southward
employed fitting a new Main Topmast stay
three Ships to leeward and one to the windward
heading S.W. by S. very squally raining weather
Lat. by Obs 7° 36' N.
Long. by Chron 112° 48' 30" W.

Wednesday November the 4th
Commences light wind and calms from
every point in the compass Six Ships
in sight heading to the Southward
Middle and Latter parts heavy squalls
of wind and from S.E. to S.W.
heading from S.W. to S.W. under all
sail Lat. by Obs 6° 14' 45" N.
Long. by Obs 112° 50' W.

from the Western Islands to the Indian Ocean

Thursday November the 5th
Commences thick cloudy weather with heavy squalls of
wind and rain from S.E. to S.W. heading
from S.W. to S.W. under all sail 4 Sails
in sight heading to the Southward employed
in Sundry jobs Middle part the same, at 2
P.M. took to the Eastward, at 9 P.M. took to
the South Westward again Lat. by Obs 5° 18' N.
Long. by Chron 112° 59' 45" W.

Friday November the 6th
Commences fine breezes and clear weather
from S.E. heading S.W. at 130 P.M. took
to the Eastward Middle and Latter parts
light winds and pleasant weather from
S.E. by S. employed in Ships duty Lat. by Obs 4° 55' N.
Long. by Chron 112° 15' W.

Saturday November the 7th
Commences with fresh winds, and pleasant
weather from S.E. by S. heading S.W. by South
under all sail, know signs yet of a fair wind,
nor any thing else that we want, the watch
employed in Ships duty Middle and Latter
parts much the same, all sail Lat. by Obs 3° 31' N.
Long. by Chron 112° 19' 30" W.

Sunday November the 8th
Commences fresh winds from South heading
W.S.W. under all sail, at 1 P.M. took to the
Eastward, nothing to be seen, at all employed
in Ships duty Middle and Latter part fresh
winds from South heading E.S.E. thick overcast
weather Lat. by Obs 3° 56' N.
Long. by Chron 112° 11' W.
