Monday Dec. the 14<sup>th</sup>

Commences light winds from N.W. steering  
S.W. at 7 P.M. finished stowing down  
150 lbs of Whale Oil, at 8 P.M. wore ship  
to the Eastward, and double reefed the Topsails  
Middle and Latter parts fresh winds from  
N.W. steering S.E. and E.S.E. at 10 P.M.  
lowered for Whales one boat struck and drew  
two ships in sight, Lat. by Obs 38° 08' S.  
Long. by Obs 56° 33' W.

Tuesday December the 15<sup>th</sup>

Commences fresh winds from N.W. steering  
E.S.E. under double reef, employed cleaning  
Whale bone, at sundown took in sail and  
to N.W. Middle and Latter parts fresh  
gales from N.W. to Nth by N, under short  
sail, Lat. by Obs 38° 19' S.  
Long. by Obs 46° 14' W.

Wednesday December the 16<sup>th</sup>

Commences fresh gales from N.W. lying by  
under short sail, at 5 P.M. shifted to  
W.N.W. heading Nth, at 8 more moderate  
kept by off East and made sail Latter part  
light winds and thick foggy weather from N.W.  
employed chasing Whales Lat. by Obs 38° 07' S.  
Long. by Obs 46° 36' W.

Thursday December the 17<sup>th</sup>

Commences light winds and calms, with thick foggy weather  
from Nth, steering East employed chasing Whales, but  
got none, Middle and Latter parts light winds and  
fog from Nth steering from S.E. to E.S.E. employed  
Chasing Whales Lat. by Obs 38° 10' S.  
Long. by Obs 1° 37' 30"

Friday December the 18<sup>th</sup>

Commences light winds from Nth steering S.E. and  
E.S.E. employed Whaling, Middle and Latter parts light  
winds and pleasant weather from the Northward  
steering S. 1 Ship in sight standing to the S.W. at 11  
A.M. lowered for Whales, and struck one  
Lat. by act. 39° 10' South  
Long. by Obs. 08° 4' 30" E.

Saturday December the 19<sup>th</sup>

Commences light winds and clear weather  
from the Northward, at 10 A.M. struck a Whale  
along side commenced cutting  
standing S.E. by E. under double reefed topsails  
wind from S.S.W. Middle and Latter parts  
light winds from S. to S.E. steering E.S.E. and  
E.N.E. Lat. by Obs 38° 50' S.  
Long. by Obs 05° E.

Sunday December the 20<sup>th</sup>

Commences fresh winds from N.E. by E. steering  
S.E. under whole topsails and gill and Spinnaker  
Middle and Latter parts fresh gales from N.E.  
and thick rainy weather steering S.E. under  
double reef and courses, Lat. by Obs 40° 05' S.  
Long. by Obs 4° 36' E.
