Commences fresh winds from W.S.W. Steering
E.S.E. under double reef'd Topsails employed
fitting a new main topsail, a very bad sea on
Middle and Latter parts fresh gales with thunder
lightning rain and hail from South to S.S.W.
Steering E.S.E. and East Lat by Obs 38.00 S
Long by Chron 11.45 E.

Thursday December the 31st
Commences fresh gales from South heading E.S.E.
under double reefs, one ship in sight Middle
and Latter parts fresh winds from the South-
ward steering from E.S.E. to S by E. under all
sail, Lat by Obs 37.59
Long by Chron 13.25 E.

Friday January the 1st 1836
Commences fresh winds from the Southward
steering S by E under all sail, at 8 P.M.
double reef'd the fore and Mizen topsails, at 2
A.M. made all sail again, steering S by E.
winds from S.S.E. to W.S.W. Lat by Obs 38.09
Long by Chron 16.23 E

Saturday January the 2nd
Commences strong winds from W.S.W. steering
S by E under double reefs, thick rainy weather
with squalls Middle and Latter parts more
moderate at 5 A.M. made sail heading S by E.
Lat by Obs 37.43 S
Long by Chron 11.57.15 E.

Sunday January the 3rd
Commences light winds from S.S.E. at 1 P.M.
more ship to W.S.W. Wind from South with
a bad swell, on fore a shoal of black fish
Middle and Latter light winds and fine weather
at 6 A.M. Commenced staving down the oil
Lat by Obs 38.33 S
Long by Chron 17.11 E.

Monday Jan the 4th
Commences light winds from E.S.E. heading South
at 6 P.M. finished staving down the oil, at 8
P.M. wind shifted to S.E. steering S.E.
Latter part fresh winds steering S by E.
double reef
Lat 39.25 S
Long 20.24.15 E

Tuesday January the 5th
Commences fresh winds from N.E. steering S by E.
under double reef'd topsails with a very strong
current Middle and Latter parts fresh gales from
N.E. steering E.S.E. under double reefs
Lat by Obs 39.19 S
Long by Chron 19.36 E.

Wednesday January the 6th
Commences fresh gales from W.S.W. steering E.S.E.
under double reefs, a bad sea on Middle and Latter
parts fine weather from South to S.E. steering from
E.S.E. to East employed mending sails
Lat by Obs 38.14 South
Long by Chron 16.04 E.

Thursday January the 7th
Commences light winds from S by E heading E by S.
under all sail, employed mending old sails
Middle and Latter parts fresh breezes from S by E
steering E by S. Lat by Obs 28.10 S
Long by Chron 28.47 E.

Friday January the 8th
Commences fresh winds from South heading
E.S.E. under all sail, at 1 P.M. double reef'd
the topsails and furl'd the mainsail Middle
part much the same Latter part thick weather
from E.S.E. heading N.E. at 5 P.M. made all
sail, Lat by Obs 31.35 S
Long by Chron 30.00 15 E

Saturday January the 9th
Commences fresh winds from S.E. heading
E.S.E. at 2 P.M. tack'd to S.W. Middle
part fresh winds from South heading W.S.W.
Latter part strong winds from the same
heading W.S.W. under double reef'd topsails
to Obs this day

Sunday January the 10th
Commences strong winds, and rain, from
South heading W.S.W. under double reefs
at 5 P.M. more to E.S.E. at 6 P.M. close
reef'd the topsails, and reef'd the foresail
Middle and Latter parts the same, lying by under
short sail, Lat by Obs 38.08 S
Long by Chron 32.44 E
