Commences fresh breezes from North steering  
E.S. under all sail, at 6 A.M. double reefed  
the topsails and furl of the main sail, and  
hull'd to E.S. for the island of Amsterdam  
Middle and latter parts fine breezes from N.W.  
at 5 P.M. kept E.S. at 8.30 P.M.  
Made the Island of Amsterdam, bearing  
E.S. dist. 40 miles Lat. by Obs 34° 25' S  
Long by Obs 79° 48' E.

Friday February the 5<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh breezes from N.W. steering  
E.S. under all sail, at 3 P.M.  
two boats went in shore, and at sun  
set returned with 1200 fish, Middle  
part fresh winds, latter part at 1 P.M.  
went in shore again a fishing, at 11  
A.M. returned with 280 fish, and 40 Coar  
fish,  
Lat. by Obs 34° 47' S  
Long by Obs 78° 40' 45' E.

Saturday February the 6<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh winds from West steering  
East under all drawing sails, at 5  
P.M. the land bearing West dist 48  
miles, Middle and latter parts fresh  
breezes from W.S. steering E.S. under all  
sail,  
Lat. by Obs 34° 54' S  
Long by Obs 81° 59' E.

Sunday February the 7<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh winds from W.S. with  
overcast weather and a heavy swell  
steering E.S. under all sail, Middle  
and latter parts fresh winds from the  
Westward steering from S.E. to E.S. under  
all sail,  
Lat. by Obs 36° 30' S  
Long by Obs 84° 40' 30' E.

Monday Feb the 8<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh winds from the Westward  
steering from S.E. to E.S. with a heavy  
swell in Middle and latter parts fresh  
winds and squally with overcast weather  
from West steering E.S. Lat. by Obs 36° 54' S  
Long Obs. 88° 00' E.

Tuesday February the 9<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh winds from W.S. steering  
East S.E. at 4 P.M. wind hauled to South  
thick overcast weather Middle and latter parts  
fresh winds from South to E.S. heading  
from E.S. to N.E. under all sail,  
Lat. by Obs 36° 26' S  
Long by Obs 90° 00' East.

Wednesday February the 10<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh winds from E.S. to South  
heading from E.S. to N.E. under all sail  
Middle and latter much the same, at 1 P.M.  
hauled to S.E. wind from East,  
Lat. by Obs 36° 01' South  
Long by Obs 90° 38' 30' E.

Thursday February the 11<sup>th</sup>  
Commences light breezes from East to E.S.  
heading from E.S. to South under all sail  
Middle and latter parts light breezes from  
S. to E.S. heading from S. by E. S.E. S  
under all sail,  
Lat. by Obs 37° 36' S  
Long by Obs 91° 09' E.

Friday February the 12<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fine breezes and clear weather from  
E.S. under all sail, nothing in sight  
Middle and latter parts fine breezes and clear  
pleasant weather from East heading S.E.  
under all sail,  
Lat. by Obs 38° 45' S  
Long by Obs 93° 21' 45' E.

Saturday February the 13<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fine breezes from E.S. steering  
S.E. under all sail, Middle part light breezes  
from N.E. latter light breezes from North steering  
S.E. under all sail, Long by Obs at 10 P.M. 94° 50' E.  
Lat. by Obs 39° 32' S  
Long by Obs 96° 04' 00' E.

Sunday Feb. the 14<sup>th</sup>  
Commences light breezes from North steering S.E.  
under all sail, employed taring down the rigging  
Middle and latter parts fine breezes from North  
steering S.E. under all sail,  
Lat. by Obs 40° 02' S  
Long by Obs 98° 24' E.
