Monday February the 15<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fine breeze from North with thick  
raining weather steering S.E. under all sail,  
Middle and Latter parts light breeze from S.E.  
by E. with thick raining weather heading N.E.  
by N. topgallant sails furled Lat. by Obs 39. 28. S  
Long by Chron 99. 55 E.

Tuesday February the 16<sup>th</sup>  
Commences light winds and thick overcast  
weather from S.E. at 3 P.M. hauled to N.W.  
under easy sail Middle part much the same  
at 4 P.M. wind hauled to N.E. steering S.E.  
at 9 P.M. wind with thick foggy weather  
by Obs. This day  
Long by Chron 120. 0. E.

Wednesday February the 17<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh winds and thick disagreeable  
weather from North at 5 P.M. hauled to  
N.W. steering S.E. with fore and Mizzen  
top gallant sails in. Middle part fresh winds  
from N.W. Latter part more moderate steering  
S.E. and S.E. under all sail,  
Lat. by Obs. 40. 08. S  
Long by Chron 124. 55 E.

Thursday February the 18<sup>th</sup>  
Commences more moderate from S.W. steering S.E.  
under all sail, with a heavy swell, Middle  
and Latter parts fresh winds and overcast weather  
from N.W. steering S.E. until 4 P.M. hauled  
to S.E. under all sail, Lat. by Obs. 41. 41. S  
Long by Chron 107. 20 E.

Friday February the 19<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh winds and thick weather  
from N.W. steering S.E. under all sail,  
Middle and Latter parts fresh winds from  
N.W. to West steering S.E. under all  
sail, Lat. by Obs. 42. 35. S  
Long by Chron 109. 0. E.

Saturday February the 20<sup>th</sup>  
Commences light winds from West, and thick  
raining weather steering S.E. at 7 P.M.  
the wind hauled to S.W. double reefed  
the topsails, Middle and Latter the same  
Long Chron 111. 34 Lat Obs 42. 39

from St Pauls towards New Zealand

Sunday Feb. the 21<sup>st</sup>  
Commences light winds and calms from  
S.E. heading S.W. at 6 P.M. the wind  
hauled to N. thick foggy weather under all  
sail, Middle and Latter parts fresh winds  
from W. to N.W. steering from S.E. to E.S.E.  
under all sail Lat. by Obs. 42. 40 S  
Long by Chron 115. 06. 15 E.

Monday Feb. the 22<sup>nd</sup>  
Commences fresh winds from N.W. steering  
E.S.E. under all sail, thick overcast  
weather Middle part fresh winds and  
thick raining weather from N.W. at 4 P.M.  
the wind hauled to West, with plenty  
of rain No Obs this day

Tuesday February the 23<sup>rd</sup>  
Commences fresh winds and thick raining  
weather from S.W. steering E.S.E. under  
double reefs at 7 P.M. daze reefed the fore  
top sail, and fore sail, Middle and Latter  
parts fresh gales from S.W. steering S.E.  
and S.E. by E. Lat. by Obs. 43. 41 S  
Long by Chron 120. 39 E.

Wednesday Feb. the 24<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh gales from S.W. steering  
E.S.E. under double reefs at 4 P.M. let  
one reef out of the main topsail, fore sail  
and fore topsail Middle and Latter parts  
fresh winds from N.W. steering steering  
from E.S.E. to E. by S. under double reefs  
at 10 P.M. let the Mainsail

Thursday Feb. the 25<sup>th</sup>

under all sail employed men & sails
