Friday February the 20th
Commences light winds from S.W. with
overcast weather, steering E.S.E. under
all sail, Middle and Latter parts light
winds and calms from S. to E.S.E.
at 9 P.M. Lamer for struck and took
along side at 9 1/2 M. a Spiny Whale

Long by obs 131.41 E

Saturday February 21st
Commences light winds and calms from
S.E. heading East. at 1 30 P.M.
Commence cutting at 5 P.M. finish
cutting the body and clear up the
decks, Middle and Latter parts light
winds and calms from the Northward
at 6 P.M. hooked on the junk, and
hoist the case, at 9 finish it, and start
the works

Sunday February the 22nd
Commences light winds and calms
from the Northward, heading East
employing sailing Middle and Latter
parts fresh winds from the Northward
steering E.S.E. under easy sail at
12 M. finish hoisting Lat by obs 44.25 S
Long by obs 132.21 E

Monday February the 23rd
Commences fresh winds from North steering
E.S.E. under easy sail at 4 struck the
oil down between decks Middle and Latter
parts fresh winds and thick cloudy
weather from the Northward, steering
E.S.E. under single reefs

Tuesday March the 1st 1856
Commences fresh winds from North
steering E.S.E. under single
reefs Middle and Latter parts fresh
winds from N.W. steering E.S.E.
Lat by obs 46.53 S
Long by obs 140.48 E

from St Paul to New Zealand

Wednesday March the 2nd
Commences fresh winds from West steering
E.S.E. under single reefs, with thick
overcast weather, and a bad fog, Middle
and Latter parts fresh winds from West
steering E.S.E. under double reefs
Lat by obs 46.15 S
Long by obs 141.35.30 E

Thursday March the 3rd
Commences fresh winds from West steering
E.S.E. under single reefs, Middle and Latter
parts fresh winds and thick rainy weather
from N.W. steering E.S.E. and E.S. under
single reefs
Lat by obs 46.06 S
Long by obs 147.03.45

Friday March the 4th
Commences light winds and thick rainy
weather from N.W. steering E.S.E. under
double reefed topsails, Middle and Latter parts
fresh winds and thick rainy weather
from N.W. steering E.S.E. under all sail
at 12 M. took in the top gallant sails
No obs this day
Long by obs 152.12

Saturday March the 5th
Commences fresh winds, and rain from
N.W. at 1 P.M. hauls reef of the top
sails and furled the gill, Middle part
much, the same Latter part fresh gales from
S.W. steering from N.E. by E. to N.E. by N. under
double reefs
Lat by obs 43.28 South
Long by obs 155.31 E

Sunday March the 6th
Commences fresh gales from S.W. and clear
weather, steering N.E. by E. under double
reefs, fore and main topsails, Mizzen top
sail furled, Middle and Latter parts
light breezes from, heading N.E. by E. under all
sail, untill 7 P.M. hauled to N.W.
Lat by obs 41.38 S
