

Ship Gasper of Fair Haven S. Raymond

Thursday March the 17th
Commences fresh gales from N.E. heading
East under close reef, thick raining
weather and no prospect of
of better. Middle part fresh gale
from N.W. steering East. Latter part
more moderate steering E. by N. under
single reefs, with thick damp weather.

Lat. by Obs. 33.56. S.
Long by Chron. 171.53. E.

Friday March the 18th
Commences light winds and thick
squally weather from the Northward
steering E. by N. under single reefs.
Middle and Latter parts much the
same, at 5 P.M. made the three Kings
bearing S.E. distant 15 miles, at 7 P.M.
tacked to the North and West.

Saturday March the 19th
Commences light winds and overcast
from N.E. heading up to the North
Cape, two ships in sight. Middle part
light winds, standing off shore until 11
P.M. tacked ship heading E. by N. under all
sail, at 12 M. passed the North Cape.

Lat. by Obs. 34.10. S.
Long by Chron. 173.57. E.

Sunday March the 20th
Commences fresh winds from N.E.
S.E. under all sail, at 5 P.M. tacked
off shore, heading N.W. at sunset the
North Cape bore West dist 30 miles.
Middle part wind weather much the
same at 1 P.M. tacked to the Eastward
at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship Mary Mitchem
of Nantucket 4.

Monday March the 21st
Commences fine breeze and clear weather
from N.E. heading in to the bay of Islands
at 9 P.M. anchored in 10 fathoms water.

Master from St. Pauls to New Zealand

at 5 A weighed Anchor and run in to
Cannervatteren and anchored in in 13 fathoms
water, the Watch went on shore.

Tuesday March the 22nd
Commences with pleasant weather from
the South all the watch on board employed
in ships duty. At 7 P.M. weighed Anchor
and run up to Shippah Bay, at 8 P.M.
came too in 8 fathoms water one watch
on liberty.

Wednesday March the 23rd
All the fore part of the day pleasant
weather commenced painting ship, commenced
craining quit painting one watch on liberty.

Thursday March the 24th
Commences thick raining weather from
S.E. sent down the fore and Mizzen
topgallant yards, at 6 P.M. the watch
came up, Latter part employed in
painting ship and boats, one watch
on liberty.

Friday March the 25th
Commences fine weather lying at Anchor
at 6 P.M. finished painting ship one
watch on liberty, Latter the same.

Saturday March the 26th
Commences fine weather one watch on
shore the other employed in ships duty.
Latter part fine the watch on shore
the other mending sails.

Sunday March the 27th
Commences fine weather one watch
on liberty, Latter part fresh winds
from N.E.

March 28th
All the 24 hours fine weather
from the Eastward, one watch
on liberty.
