Sunday April the 3rd
Commences fine weather from S.W.
one watch on shore the other employed
in ships duty Latter part strong
winds at 9 P.M. have short the
wind came a head and gave
her chain again

Monday April the 4th
Commences strong wind from N.W.
all hands on board at 11 P.M. let go
the Larkins Anchor wind hauled
to S.W. Latter part much the
same at 7 P.M. weighed the
Larkins Anchor and got ready
for sea

in the Bay of Islands New Zealand

Tuesday April the 5th
Commences with light winds from
S.W. employed in ships duty at 4 P.M.
have short at 9 P.M. weighed anchor
and stood out to sea at 12 M. Cape Owen
bearing E. by S.

Wednesday April the 6th
Commences fine weather from S.W.
steering N. by E. under all sail at 1 P.M.
spoke the ship Erie one day out
Middle and Latter parts much the
same

Sunday April the 10th
Commences strong winds and thick
rainy weather from N.E. steering
N.W. Middle part the same
Latter more moderate at 6 P.M.
more to the Eastward
