to S.E.W. at 5 P.M. had a heavy squall
from the Eastward double reef'd the
top sails, at 6 P.M. made all sail,
steering W.S.W.

Friday April the 12th

Commences fresh gales from S.W. to S.E.W.
lying too under close reef at half past
10 spoke ship Erie of New Port
Middle part more moderate, at 1 P.M. made
sail, steering S.W. in company with the
Erie, at 5 P.M. kept off W.S.W. for the
Land.

Saturday April the 13th

Commences fine breezes from the
Eastward steering W.S.W. under
all sail, at 5 P.M. shorten'd sail
at sunset Cape Paliser long West
dist. 5 Leagues, Middle part much
the same heading W.S.W. at 3 P.M.
hove to Cape Paliser bearing N.E. by E.
at 6 P.M. kept off W.S.W.

Raymond Master Lying in Cloudy Bay

Sunday April the 14th
Commences fresh winds from the Eastward
steering W.S.W. under all sail, in company
with the ship Erie, of New Port. At one
P.M. cast anchor in Cloudy bay in 9
fathoms water, unbent our sails and
hoisted our Topmasts, Middle part fresh
winds from the Eastward, latter part
at 7 P.M. hove up the anchor and
went up the bay, at 9 cast anchor
in five fathoms water.

Monday April the 15th
Commences fine weather from the
Eastward, employ'd mousing ship
and hauling Topmasts at 6 P.M.
2 Boats went out a Whaling at 4 returned
without any success.

Tuesday April the 16th
Commenced with fine weather from
S.E. at 4 o'clock the boats returned
without any whale, Middle part fine
weather latter part at 4 sent 3 boats
a Whaling.

Wednesday April the 17th
Commences fine weather at 4 P.M.
3 Boats went out a Whaling the
rest employ'd clearing ship.

Thursday April the 18th
Commences fine weather from S.E.
employ'd clearing ship for Whaling
at 5 the Boats returned with 2
puffing Dugs, Middle part fine
weather latter at 5 P.M. 3 Boats
went out a Whaling.
