Wednesday October the 19th
Commences fresh winds from the
N. W. heading W. S. W. under storm
sails Middle and Latter parts fresh
gales from West heading S. S. W. under
storm sails, at 8 P.M. without and
repaired the Foresail Lat. by Obs 37.16 S
Long by Obs 143.52 W.

Thursday October the 20th
Commences more moderate at 1 P.M.
the wind shifted to S. S. W. and
at 4 P.M. more ship to the Westward
1 whale in sight Middle and Latter
parts fresh gales from West at 8 P.M.
more to the Eastward, and at 10 P.M.
more to N. W. W. Lat. by Obs 37.20 S
Long by Obs 143.59 W.

Friday October the 21st
Commences fresh gales from the W.
heading N. W. W. under double reef
at 5 P.M. lowered 1 Boat the 2nd
Boat struck and drove, Middle and
Latter parts fresh winds from
the W. working to the windward
Lat. by Obs 37.20 S
Long 143 34

Raymond Master Cruising for Whales

Saturday October the 22nd
Commences fresh winds from W. W. W.
at 5 P.M. lowered 1 Boat and struck
1 whale killed them both at sunset
took one along side and left the
other Middle and Latter parts fresh
gales from the Western isle at 5 P.M.
the fluke rope broke and lost the other
Lat. by Obs 37.28 S
Long by Obs 143.15 W.

Sunday October the 23rd
Commences fresh gales from the Western
working to the windward Middle and
Latter parts fresh winds from W. N. W.
to S. W. working to the windward
Lat. by Obs 37.31 S
Long by Obs 143.32 W.

Monday October the 24th
Commences more moderate made more
sail, ten thousand Whales to half shore
but too rugged to lower for them
wind from W. N. W. at sunset took
in sail Middle and Latter parts much
the same, with a plenty of Whales
Lat. by Obs 37.50 S
Long by Obs 143.20 W.

Tuesday October the 25th
Commences fresh gales and a heavy
from West heading N. W. W. under
sails 8 Wright Whales in sight
but rugged to lower Middle and
Latter parts fresh gales from the
heading S. W. W. under storm sails
Lat. by Obs 37.20 S
Long by Obs 143.20 W.
