Commences fine weather from S. S. E. employ'd Whaling, at 2 P. M. lowered 3 Boats struck hild and took along side one right and finish'd cutting him in good clear up the decks Middle and Latter parts light winds and calms from the Eastward employ'd hailing Lat. by Obs 37. 53 S. Long by Obs 173. 54. 45 E.

Monday October the 21st
Commences fine weather from the Eastward employ'd hailing, at 2 P. M. spoke the Mary Mitchell of Nantucket, at sunset the Ocean was full of Whales heading to the South and East, Middle and Latter parts fine weather from N. E. by E to N. W. by N. under easy sail, employ'd hailing and stowing down Oil Long by Obs 174. 18 S. Lat. by Obs 37. 18 S.

Tuesday November the 1st
Commences fine weather from N. E. by N. heading S. E. by E. employ'd stowing down Oil, and hailing at 4 P. M. finish'd hailing, at 6 P. M. more to the N. W. under easy sail, Middle and Latter parts fine weather from the Eastward employ'd stowing down, at 11 P. M. finish'd stowing down 144 bbls of Oil,
