more to S.E.

Commences fine weather from the

Westward, at 9 P.M. double reefed the  
Topsails

Sunday January the 1<sup>st</sup> 1837  
Commences fine weather from the Westward

very fresh winds S.W. Lat. by Obs. 41.10 N.  
Long. by Chron. 164.33.30 W.

Monday January the 2<sup>nd</sup> 1837  
Commences fresh gales from S.W. steering  
E.S.E. under double reefs. At 5 P.M.  
have too under storm sails heading West  
Middle part much the same, Latter at daylight  
made sail, and more to the Southward, wind  
from W.S.W.
