Friday Jan. the 10th
Commences fresh gales from N.W. steering
from S.W. by S. to W.S.W. at 3 P.M. double
reef'd plenty of rain, took in all sail
Middle and latter parts strong gales from
N.W. at daylight set double reef'd topsails
at 11 A.M. took them in again, wind S.W.
heading W.S.W. Lat. by Obs. 43. 42 S
Long by Chron. 170. 09 W.

Saturday Jan. the 11th
Commences strong gales from S.W.
heading W.S.W. under storm sails
Middle and latter parts fresh gales from
W.S.W. lying too under storm sails
Lat. by Obs. 43. 48 S
Long by Chron. 170. 06 W.

Sunday January the 12th
Commences fresh gales from W.S.W. lying
by under storm sails, at 1 P.M. set double
reef'd topsails, at 5 P.M. hauled for
struck and 3 Sperm Whales, and took
them along side, heading South, at 6 A.M.
commenced cutting Lat. by Obs. 42. 42 S

Monday January the 13th
Commences calm, employed cutting at 3
P.M. finished, latter parts wind from
North steering W.S.W. under easy sail,
employed hailing Lat. by Obs. 42. 42
Long by Chron. 170. 08 W.

Master Cruising for Whales

Tuesday January the 14th
Commences fine breezes from North with
thick overcast weather, employed hailing
Middle part the same latter calm at 5 P.M.
finished hailing, Lat. by Obs. 42. 50 S
Long by Chron. 170. 09 W.

Wednesday Jan. the 15th
Commences light breezes and calms from
N.E. steering W.S.W. under all sail, at sunset
took in sail, at daylight made sail, and
broke out the fore hale, and commenced stanning
down, Lat. by Obs. 43. 05 S
Long by Chron. 170. 48 W.

Thursday January the 16th
Commences fresh breezes from W.S.W. heading
S.W. under double reefs, at 2 P.M. finished
stanning down 67. lbs of Sperm oil,
Middle and latter parts fresh winds from
the Westward heading from S.W. to S.S.W. under
double reefs. Lat. by Obs. 43. 49 S
Long by Chron. 171. 58 W.

Friday January the 17th
Commences fresh breezes from West heading
S.S.W. at 1 P.M. more to the N.W.
Middle part light winds and rain, at 10 P.M.
took to S.W. wind from W.S.W. at
2 A.M. wind shifted to South
with rain, steering W.S.W. under
all sail, Lat. by act. 43. 40 S
Long by Chron. 172. 54 W.
