Monday Feb. the 27th
Commences light winds and calms from the South with rain, hove short, Middle and Latter parts light winds and calms from the South at 7 A.M. got under way, and stood out of the harbor.

Tuesday Feb. the 28th
Commences light winds from the South at 3 P.M. the weather proving unfavourable took the ship and stood back, and at 6 P.M. cast anchor at the old place. Middle and Latter parts fine light breezes with showers of rain, from the South.

Wednesday March the 1st
Commences fine weather from the South Middle part fine weather at 4 P.M. took our anchor and went to sea, with a fine breeze from the South.

Thursday March the 2nd
Commences fine N.E. steering from South to East, at sunset took in sail Middle part fine weather Latter the same at daylight made all sail.

Friday March the 3rd
Commences fresh winds from N.E. heading East, under double reef, nothing in sight, Middle and Latter parts fresh winds from S.W. at 7 P.M. went on board, the Ruelin Carter, and discharged 2 men, Robert Barker and George Smith,

Monday March the 6th
Commences fresh winds from the South steering E.S.E. under all sail, with overcast weather, Middle and Latter parts fresh winds from S.E. to E.S.E. heading from E.S.E. to E. under all sail, Lat. by Obs. 42. 19 S
Long. by Obs. 174. 53. W.

Tuesday March the 7th
Commences fresh winds from E.S.E. heading N.E. at 2 P. reefed the fore and Mizzen Topsails Middle and Latter parts fresh winds from S.E. heading E.S.E. Lat. by Obs. 41. 12 S
Long. by Obs. 175. 59. W.

Wednesday March the 8th
Commences fresh winds from N.E. heading E.S.E. under double reef, Middle the same at 7 P.M. more ship to S.E. wind from East Lat. by Obs. 40. 51 S
Long. by Obs. 175. 15 W.
