Monday May the 15<sup>th</sup>  
Commences strong gales from the South  
at 2 P.M. came to anchor 2 miles below  
the Fort at Santa Cruz Middle part  
much the same latter fine weather  
the Barge Dawson drop'd below the fort

Tuesday May the 16<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fine weather from N.E. at 3 P.M.  
a Genoese Brig came in for water loaded  
with old brains, Middle and latter  
parts the same all hands employ'd  
getting of water

Wednesday May the 17<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fine weather from North  
all hands employ'd watering, and  
fitting for sea Middle and latter parts  
the same

Thursday May the 18<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fine weather from the South  
employ'd fitting for sea,

Friday May the 19<sup>th</sup>  
At 11 A.M. weigh'd anchor and stood  
out of the Harbor the Capt. took a boat  
and went up to survey the ship lying  
off and on by Ananido

Saturday May the 20<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh winds from S.W. at  
6 P.M. 5 brought her two anchors the Palace  
of ~~Spain~~ came in, at 10 A.M. the Capt  
returned, at 12 M. got under way and went  
to sea wind from S.E. spoke the ship Sunday  
Port of New York 15 9 miles out

Commences fresh winds from the East  
Middle and latter parts light wind and  
thick foggy weather with a head tide so  
ends

Monday May the 22<sup>nd</sup>  
Commences light winds and Rain from  
the Westward Middle and latter parts  
the same, at 12 M. Ananido Bane N. S. W.  
dist 30 miles from which I take my departure  
it being in the Lat. of 27.17. South Long. 28.49 W.

Tuesday May the 23<sup>rd</sup>  
Commences light airs and rain from  
the South, Middle and latter parts fresh  
gales from the S.W. took in and made  
sail according Dist. 38 Dep. 35. Dep. Lat. 14. Lat. 28.101

Wednesday May the 24<sup>th</sup>  
Commences fresh gales from S.E. under  
double reef at 6 P.M. have her two  
heads S.E. making about a North drift  
at 8 P.M. Made sail steering S. by N.  
Lat. by Obs. 26 18. S. Long Obs. 45.30 W.

Thursday May the 25<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with light airs and rain  
Middle and latter parts fine weather  
from S.W. all hands employ'd  
fitting Boats

Lat by Obs 26 09 S  
Long Obs 45 30
