Commences fresh winds from  
N. W. employd in Ships duty  
at 9 A.M. commenced bailing out our  
Whale

Thursday August the 30<sup>th</sup> 18  
Commences fine weather, employd  
bailing at 3 P. M. the Capt. of the  
Samuel Wright came from Two  
People Bay with two boats for  
Tobacco Bran Hoops, Shoes &c.
