

Ship Jasper of Fairhaven bound out to Seavitt Master

Remarks on board Wednesday October 2nd 1839

Commences with strong winds from E heading
SSE with Topsails reefed the watch employed
making spinnym middle part squally
At 9 AM wind SSE tacked ship heading NE
Lat by Obs 30° 27' N Long by Chron 35° 29' W

Remarks on board Thursday October the 3rd

Commences with strong winds from ESE heading
NE with squally weather under single reef
Topsails at 6 AM tacked ship heading S at 2
PM tacked again heading NE latter part light
breezes made all sail
Lat by Obs 31° 55' N Long by Chron 34° 55' W

Remarks on board Friday October the 4th

Commences with light breezes from ESE
Heading NE with pleasant weather one man
dick and off duty at 2 PM tacked to the S
At 8 PM tacked again to the NE with light
squalls of rain the watch employed making
spinnym so ends another day with a head wind
Lat by Obs 32° 34' N Long by Chron 34° 09' W

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Remarks on board Saturday October the 5th

Commences with moderate breezes from E to SE
Heading from NNE to ESE with squally weather took
In the fore and main topgallant sails middle and
latter part the same so ends these 24 hours
Lat by Obs 32° 36' N Long 32° 36' W

Remarks on board Sunday October the 6th

Commences with light breezes from SE heading
ENE at 10 PM tacked to the S with baffling
breezing winds latter part saw 4 sail
Lat by Obs 33° 34' N Long by Chron 32° 25' W

Remarks on board Monday October the 7th

Commences with moderate breezes from
ESE heading S with pleasant weather middle
part squally took in topgallant sails and reefed
The topsails latter part pleasant made sail
Lat by Obs 31° 52' N Long 31° 36' W
