

Journal of a voyage on board Ship Jasper cruising
Sunday March the 22nd
Commences with strong gales E S E employed clearing
Up decks and furled the fore sail middle part
Took in the Mizzen and H S M stay sail latter
part blowing a tremendous gale from SE at 9 AM
Took in the Main Top sail lying too on the Starboard tack
Lat by D R 32.25 S Long 179.20 W

Remarks on board Monday March the 23rd
Commences with a Hurricane from E S E to W with
Rain and salt water flying with a Whales body in the
Blubber room latter part wind W dying away a little
Employed cutting up the blubber and putting it in casks
Lat 31.29 S Long 179.07 W

Remarks on board Tuesday March the 24th
Commences with strong gales from W employed cutting
Up the blubber at 2 P.M. set the Main Top sail
Middle part the same at 7 AM set the
Fore sail and began to boil still very rugged
Lat 32.08 S Long 178.30 W

Remarks on board Wednesday March the 25th
Commences with strong winds from W employed
Boiling at 10 AM finished boiling
Lat 32.04 S Long 178.10 W

Remarks on board Thursday March the 26th
Commences with strong winds from S W lying too
At sun set took in the fore sail middle and
latter fresh gales from W at 7 AM began to stow
Down at 11 finished and cleared up the decks
Lat 32.29 S Long 178.26 W

Remarks on board Friday March the 27th
Commences with strong gales from W lying too
Middle and latter part the same with the
Wind from W to S with squally weather
Lat 32.21 S Long 178.25 W

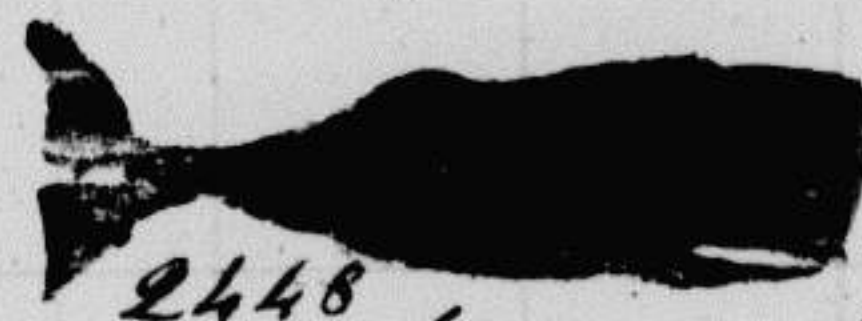
For Spearm Whales round the French Rock Howland ^{Sanitt}

Remarks on board Saturday March the 28th
Commences with strong gales from S lying too
Middle and latter part more moderate at 8 AM
Set the fore sail and Top sails double reefed
Lat 31.35 S Long 178.46 W

Remarks on board Sunday March the 29th
Commences with strong breezes from S heading N^o 6
At 1 P.M. saw the french Rock bearing N^o 7 W
Distance 14 mile wore ship to the E S E with thick
Weather latter part steering E by N squally
Lat 31.58 S Long 177.21 W

Remarks on board Monday March the 30th
Commences with strong breezes from S W
Steering N^o 6 by E at sun set took in sail still
steering off at sun set took in sail latter part
Employed repairing the Main Spencer
Lat 31.09 S Long 176.12 W

Remarks on board Tuesday March the 31st
Commences with fresh winds from W at 2 P.M. saw
Whales at 2 past 4 lowered struck and killed
At 8 cut and came on board in a squall and
left the Whale dead at sun rise made sail looking
For the Whale at 9 AM found him and took him
to the Ship at 10 began to cut our spouts 5 miles off
Lat 31.46 S Long 176.14 W



2448 Steward the 2nd
Remarks on board Wednesday April the 1st
Commences with fresh breezes from W employed
Cutting at 5 P.M. finished at 8 began to boil
Middle and latter part squally at 8 AM saw
Whales lowered and came back in squall
And double reefed the Top sails
Lat 31.15 S Long 176.20 W

Remarks on board Thursday April the 2nd
Commences squally with the wind from W to
At 1 P.M. lowered again at 4 struck and lost
The line this days work on the other side
