

Journal of a voyage on board Ship Jasper of

Wednesday July the 22nd 1840

Commences with calm and pleasant weather
One watch on liberty the other employed
Painting Ship and Ends much the same

Remarks onboard Thursday July 23rd 1840

All these 24 hours overcast weather some rain employd
cleaning and painting ship one watch on liberty
All came on board except Mr Fox, the mate so ends

Remarks onboard Friday July 24th 1840

All these 24 hours employd stowing down water and repairing
shuttling on the hulk furnish painting one watch
on liberty Mr Fox remains on shore so ends

Remarks onboard July Saturday 25th 1840

All these 24 hours pleasant weather employd stowing
off water and other duty one watch on liberty
through the day the mate had not returned so ends

Remarks onboard Sunday July 26th 1840

All these 24 hours pleasant weather lost the sails
to dry all hands on shore except six to fuel the
stove. The mate has not returned

Remarks onboard Monday July 27th 1840

All these 24 hours pleasant weather all hands onboard
employd fitting the ships rigging then and then
discharged Mr Fox mate of the ship for inventing the
new, disobedient of orders and repeated insolence in
presence of all on board, his 2nd mate second mate in place
Mr Fox so discharged. Shipped a man by the name of
John Munchel to second mate with 7/45th

Remarks onboard Tuesday July 28th 1840

All these 24 hours pleasant weather one watch
employd to work on the ships rigging
sent on boat to paint yards for yams

Remarks on board July 29th 1840 -

these 24 hours pleasant weather one watch gone
after yams one watch on liberty the rest
employd on ships duty so ends

Remarks on board July 30th 1840

these 24 hours pleasant weather Employed
taking on board provisions made the sails
Boat returned from paint yards. Discharge

Remarks on board July 31st 1840

these 24 hours pleasant weather
one watch on liberty the rest employd
on ships duty so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Aug 1st 1840 -

these 24 hours pleasant weather Employed
in ship duty painted one Boat for the
ship so ready for sea with the exception
of four men so ends

Remarks on board Sunday August 2nd 1840

first part pleasant weather all hands
to Church latter part heavy rain
third part 8 1/2
