

Ship Jasper of Fairhaven on the coast of
Remarks on board October 10th 1840.

The first part of these 24 hours a moderate breeze from E laying
to the middle part calm both cut the after hok and stowed down
88 barrels of oil the latter part a light breeze from W saw whales
leired but did not fasten so Ends, Lat by Ob 35° 45' N

Remarks on board Sun October 11th 1840
all these 24 hours a brisk breeze from E to W all hands
employed boiling and stowing down oil 11 hales in
sight 2 ships also so Ends Lat by Ob 35° 38' N
Long by Chron 172° 50' W

Remarks on board Mon October 12th 1840
all these 24 hours a pleasant weather wind from E to
N W saw whales leired fastened killed and took along
side all hands employed cutting in and boiling and
stowing down oil so Ends Lat by Ob 36° 00' N
Long by Chron 172° 17' W

Remarks on board Tues October 13th 1840
all these 24 hours a brisk breeze from N W saw 11 whales leired
but did not fasten all hands employed boiling and breaking
out the fore hok & 1 ship in sight so Ends Lat by Ob 35° 49' N
Long by Chron 172° 25' W

Remarks on board Wed October 14th 1840
all these 24 hours a brisk breeze from N W to S W by
W all hands employed boiling and stowing down oil
saw whales leired but did not fasten so Ends
Lat by Ob 35° 50' N

Remarks on board Thu October 15th 1840
all these 24 hours a pleasant weather light winds from S by E
first part saw right whales leired fastened and parted line
about took in shil for the night the middle part made all
sail saw 1 right whale, 1 sperm whale going quick leired but did
not get near them all hand employed scraping bone so Ends
Lat by Ob 35° 52' N Long by Chron 172° 15' W

Remarks on board Fri October 16th 1840

the first part these 24 hours calm I could not feel the topsails
for the night the middle part a brisk breeze from S W made all
sail saw 11 whales leired fastened killed and took along side
1 boat stove the latter part the wind veered to the northward and
westward blowing a gale cut in the 11 whales leired but the head
1 ship in sight so Ends no Ob

Remarks on board Sat October 17th 1840
all these 24 hours a strong gale and a heavy swell from N W
laying to under short sail all hands employed boiling and
mudding a stove Boat & so Ends, Lat by Ob 36° 00' N
Long by Chron 172° 23' W

Remarks on board Sun October 18th 1840
the first part of these 24 hours a moderate breeze from N W
saw whales but did not leire the middle part made all sail
finished boiling saw whales leired but did not get near them
they were going to fast for us wind as before mentioned the
latter part the same all hands employed scraping bone and filling
cask & 1 ship in sight so Ends Lat by Ob 35° 54' N
Long by Chron 172° 08' W

Remarks on board Mon October 19th 1840
the first part of these 24 hours a moderate breeze from N W
saw a chad whale leired 1 boat and took him along side he
promised to be good for nothing, let him go the middle and
latter part strong gales from N W to W saw 3 ships Boiling
saw 11 whales to suggest to leire all hands employed stowing down
oil setting up sheers & so Ends Lat by Ob 35° 58' N Long by Chron 172° 30' W

Remarks on board Tues October 20th 1840
all these 24 hours a strong gale from N W saw whales leired
but did not get near them all hands employed setting up
sheers 1 ship in sight so Ends Lat by Ob 36° 07' N
Long by Chron 172° 36' W

Remarks on board Wed October 21th 1840
the first part of these 24 hours a strong breeze from N W
the middle part the wind veered S by E blowing a
strong gale the latter part a moderate breeze but a
heavy swell saw 1 whale leired fastened killed took along
side so Ends Lat by Ob 35° 56' N Long by Chron 172° 43' W
Dist 173° 33' W
