

Ship passed at Barehaven off the Coast of
 Remarks onboard Mon February 21st 1841
 the first part a moderate breeze from E steering to the South
 with all sail set got ready and commenced boiling pork
 in fore part the night the middle part the wind veered
 to the North heading E & S now ship heading NW & W
 the latter part wind the same but a strong breeze set the
 top sail steering NW now ship heading ESE saw Whales
 land and chart came aboard and Duffy reaped the top sails
 4 ship in sight so Ends the day Sat by Ob 45:02 S
 Long by Chron 119:40 E

Remarks onboard Mon February 22nd 1841
 all these 24 hours a strong breeze from N heading NW & W
 saw Whales to beget to land took in fore part the night and
 finished boiling the middle part the wind veered to the South
 and blew a strong gale took in fore part close reaped the
 main top sail the latter wind the same now ship to the
 westward Employed stowing down oil so Ends no Ob

Remarks onboard Tues February 23rd 1841
 the first part a strong gale from N by W now ship heading
 ESE Employed stowing down oil the middle the wind
 moderated a little the latter part wind veered to the East
 and made all sail steering to the westward and Eastward saw Whales
 land fastened to one killed her and took her along side
 and got ready for cutting so Ends Sat by Ob 44:42 S Long by Chron 119:40 E

Remarks onboard Wed February 24th 1841
 the first part a moderate breeze from SE & E
 laying to with a Whale along side all hands Employed
 cutting finished and finished the ship for the night the
 middle part to N & W now ship heading E & E all hands
 Employed boiling the latter part in all all sail a more
 clear breeze from N & W steering N now Whales landed
 and chart but did not fasten came aboard so Ends
 Sat by Ob 44:40 S

Remarks onboard Thurs February 25th 1841
 these 24 hours commenced with a moderate breeze from N & N E
 steering E by S all sail set of 2 PM speared ship steering N & W
 saw Whales & PM landed fastened with a made fast to the Whales
 and came near towing with 2 boats suddenly the wind shifted
 to S with a severe squall and blew a violent gale first
 a wave in the Whales cut from her and wind against took
 in all sail by to under a main spencer heading E by S & E
 down the works at 3 PM the wind veered at 5 PM moderate a
 little the main top sail close reefed and now ship heading
 N by W at 5 PM commenced boiling at 8 set the fore sail &
 2 ship in sight no further remarks to make so Ends
 Sat by Ob 44:22 S Long by Chron 119:48 E

Remarks onboard Frid February 26th 1841
 the first part a strong gale from NE & E laying to heading
 N by W now ship to the Eastward moderated a little set
 close reefed top sail the middle part the wind and
 weather much the same heading N by W the latter part the
 breeze moderated set single reefed top sail now ship to the
 Eastward all hands Employed stowing down oil and
 boiling saw one fin of ship in sight so Ends
 Sat by Ob 44:28 S Long by Chron 119:26 E

Remarks onboard Sat February 27th 1841
 all these 24 hours pleasant weather a moderate breeze
 from S & S W finished boiling and stowing down oil
 saw Whales landed and chart but got none top in sail
 at night made it again in the morning 2 ship in
 sight no further remarks to make so Ends
 no Ob
