 the first part a moderate breeze from E Whales in sight hauled fastened to a hill and sunk the middle part wind and Weather much the same the latter a moderate breeze from E to ESE and Whales hauled to one killed him took him along side and cut him in took in sail at night and made sail in the morning Employed boiling &c so Ends Set by Ob 44 41 28

Remarks onboard Tues March 2nd 1841
 all these 24 hours pleasant Weather a moderate breeze from the northward and Eastward a plenty of Whales in sight During the day hauled fastened to a hill and hauled from E all hands Employed boiling and throwing down oil took in sail at night and made sail in the morning further Remarks to make so Ends Set by Ob

 Remarks onboard Wed March 3rd 1841

the first part a moderate breeze from the N.E. boats down after Whales fastened to one killed him and took the 2 along side and cut one in made the other part for the night and took in sail wind and Weather the same Employed boiling in the commencing throwing down oil at half past 11 and checked of the fore lower Deck hatch with it so Ends the Day Set by Ob 44 48 8



Remarks onboard Thurs March 4th 1841
 the first part a moderate breeze from the northward and Eastward all hands Employed cutting in a Whale the middle wind shifted to W and blew a strong gale of wind and rain covered down the work and took all sail and gave ship heading to the Eastward the latter part the wind veered to the Eastward and moderate little set the fore sail kept and commenced boiling and setting up stows hatching out between decks &c so Ends Set by Ob 48 16 S Long by Ob 118 58 E

Remarks onboard Fri March 5th 1841
 all these 24 hours pleasant Weather light breeze from SE to W laying to under short sail all hands Employed boiling and throwing down oil in the afternoon and setting up stows at a host of the saw a Whale by to with the main yard aback the remainder of day no further Remarks to make so Ends Set by Ob 48 12 S
