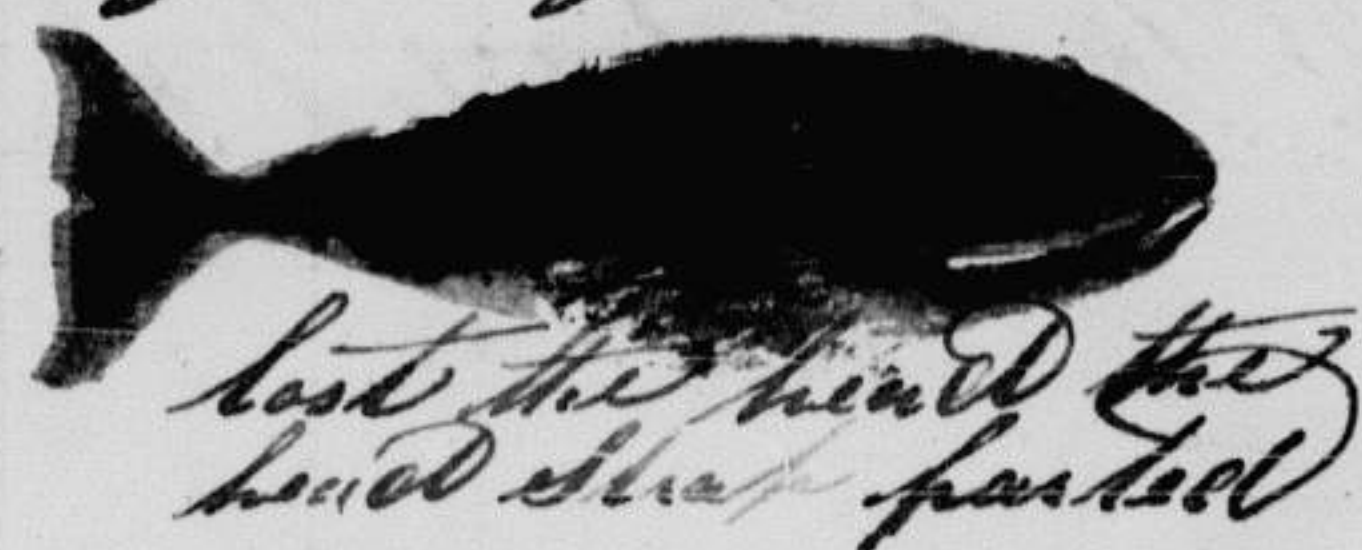


Ship Jasper of Newhaven of the Coast of
 Remarks onboard Sat March 6th 1841
 all these 24 hours pleasant weather with gentle
 breeze from W to NW all hands employed bailing
 and throwing down oil setting up sharks &c and so on
 in the morning saw one Right Whale bailed and
 chased 3 ships in sight &c &c so ends the day

Remarks onboard Mon March 7th 1841
 the first part a heavy breeze from N W saw one Whale bailed
 and chased came aboard the middle part Double Bailed the topsail
 for the night were ship heading NW all hands employed bailing
 and throwing down oil setting up sharks the latter part made
 up sail light tower from N W checked off the bar hole with oil some
 Whales bailed fastened to 2 parties from one hull of the other and
 took him along side so ends the day Sat by 08 45: 07 of
 Long by 140 179:45

Remarks onboard Tues March 8th 1841
 the first part light air from the northward and Westward
 all hands employed cutting in a Whale closed up topsail
 for the night the middle part a strong breeze from N W
 furlled the fore and main topsail kept the main
 near ship heading N by E the latter part a moderate
 breeze from Southward and Eastward set the fore topsail
 Double Bailed Whales in sight and 2 ships all hands
 employed bailing setting up sharks so ends Sat by 06 45: 07 of



Remarks onboard Tues March 9th 1841
 the first part a moderate breeze from N W saw one Whale
 bailed and chased but did not fasten the middle part
 took in sail for the night and finished bailing wings
 and rather much the same more ship heading NW
 the latter part made sail saw Whales bailed and
 chased all hands employed throwing oil between decks
 so ends Sat by 08 44: 51 of



Newenland Cruising for Whales Harbours South West
 Remarks onboard Wed March 10th 1841
 the first part a strong breeze from N W saw Whales bailed
 and chased but could not fasten the middle part took in
 sail for the night wind from N heading NW
 struggle set close Reefed topsail saw Whales to struggle
 to for all hands employed throwing oil between decks and
 setting up sharks &c so ends Sat by 06 44: 52 of

Remarks onboard Thurs March 11th 1841
 the first part a strong breeze from N W heading N E the middle part
 took in sail for the night wind veered to Westward heading N E
 the latter part wind much the same set close Reefed topsail saw
 Whales to windward to struggle to for all hands employed setting up
 sharks During the day finished throwing down oil and checked the
 cash between decks so ends the day Sat by 06 44: 53 of Long by 140 179:30

Remarks onboard Fri March 12th 1841
 the first part a moderate breeze from the northward and
 Westward saw a plenty of Whales to windward the middle
 part wind from N heading to the South the latter part
 wind much the same saw Whales bailed fastened to one
 hull and took him along side and cut him in so ends the
 day



Remarks onboard Sat March 13th 1841
 the first part a moderate breeze from the westward a plenty
 of Whales bailed fastened to one hull and sunk back down
 bailed a gain but did not fasten spoke the Alexander Binkley
 boats found by them she had got 3 or 4 by the middle part
 took in sail for the night wind from W to N squally
 with some rain the latter part light breeze from different
 quarters saw Whales bailed fastened hull and sunk all
 hands employed bailing tossing &c so ends no Ob
