

Ship Jasper Parkhouse of the Coast of
 Remarks onboard Sun March 14th 1841
 the first part calm Whales in sight and 3 ships boiling
 the middle part a light breeze from the Westward took
 in sail and made sail all hands employed boiling the
 latter part and Whales boiled fastened and killed and
 violent squall left the Whales and went opened Cleared
 down all sails took the Whales along side when the squall
 was over so Ends no C

Remarks onboard Mon March 15th 1841
 the first part a strong gale from W commenced cutting
 cut 3 blunts pieces the fourth one torn out carried away
 one of the fluke chain but parted the fluke chain and
 lost the remainder of the Whales the middle part further
 all the for the night the gale still harder more ships to
 the north the latter the wind veered to Southward heading
 to the Westward heavy squalls kept the fore sail and set
 it all variously employed so Ends the day Sat by C 44: 58
 Long by C 179: 58

Remarks onboard Tues March 16th 1841
 all these 24 hours a strong gale from W at 3
 the Commenced boiling set the fore sail and were ships
 heading W & W broke out between decks forward and put
 down 9 Cask of Bread so Ends Sat by C 44: 38
 Long by C 179: 58

Remarks onboard Wed March 17th 1841
 all these 24 hours commenced with a strong gale from
 W & W heading W & W at 3 the finished boiling and took in
 the fore sail blowing a little stronger employed clearing up
 decks and running the oil on Deck so Ends Sat by C 44: 01
 Long by C 179: 58

Remarks onboard Thurs March 18th 1841
 all these 24 hours a strong gale from W heading W & W
 the middle part and latter the squall set the fore and main
 down these 1 Whales so Ends Sat by C 44: 22
 Long by C 178: 31

Remarks onboard Fri March 19th 1841
 all these 24 hours a strong gale from W heading W & W at 6
 the set the fore sail and were ships to the Northward
 and Westward part the ship called of Newfongdon left
 with no further Remarks to make so Ends these 24 hours
 Sat by C 44: 23 Long by C 178: 31

Remarks onboard Sat March 20th 1841
 the first part a strong breeze from W heading W & W
 spoke a strong ship from Newfongdon left North W
 minutes out 600 bells the name of the ship we saw not
 the middle part wind and course much the same but milder
 ate the latter part nearly calm light air from the Northward
 as a Eastward made sail showing 2 ships all hands employed
 showing down out 2 ships in sight so Ends the day
 Sat by C 44: 00 Long by C 179: 58

Remarks onboard Sun March 21st 1841
 the first part a moderate breeze from N & N E showing
 W & W with all sail set finished showing down
 oil the middle part wind and course much the same
 the latter part and Whales boiled fastened to killed
 and took along side and commenced cutting 2 ships
 in sight no further Remarks to make so Ends
 Sat by C 44: 11 Long by C 179: 17
