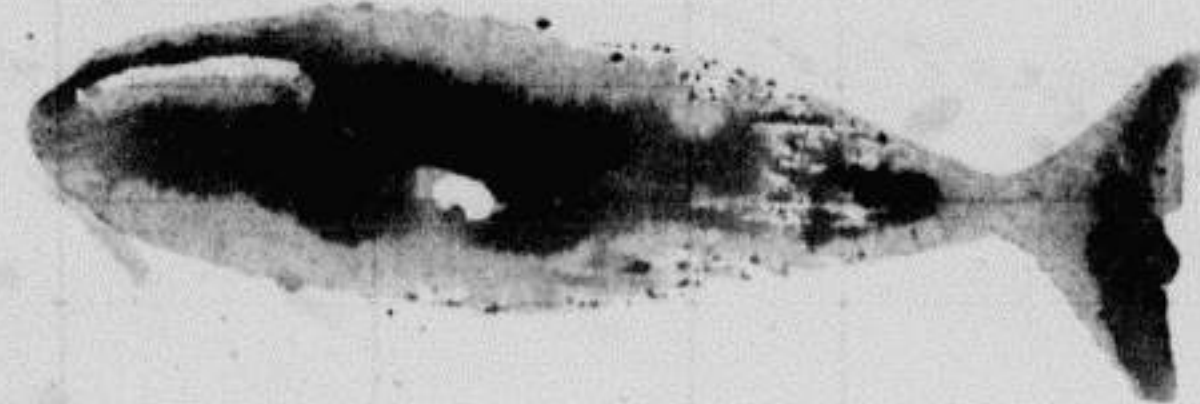
Monmouth onboard Tues March 23th 1841
 the first part a strong breeze from N by W a
 large number of whales in sight hoisted the fastened to
 on and dived the middle part the wind heeled on
 to a strong gale split the main topsail raising it
 cleaved up and fished it for sail also the latter part
 the gale moderate & little heeled the main topsail
 and kept an other set the topsail all single reefed
 and for sail all hands Employed heeling No Ends

Monmouth onboard Wed March 24th 1841
 the first part a strong breeze from N heading N by W
 finished heeling the middle part took in, and for the
 night heeling N by W a moderate breeze from N the
 latter part more ship to the Eastward Employed
 blowing down oil and finished 200 one Right Whale
 and one finback No Ends

Sat by Ob 43: 59.8

Monmouth onboard Wed March 25th 1841
 the first part a breeze from the Southward and
 Right Whale hoisted fastened to me heeled took a long
 side and made fast for the night and for the sail
 a moderate breeze strong night from the Westward at
 6 PM commenced cutting at 10 finished set Double
 raised top sail now Whales hoisted fastened so ended



Sat by Ob 44: 33.8
 Long by Chron 178: 39.0

Monmouth onboard Thurs March 26th 1841
 these 24 hours commenced with a strong breeze from
 N by W the boats down 1 part to the Whale killed and
 took along side at 4 PM blowing a strong gale at 8 PM
 4 PM parted the fluke chain made sail lower 1 boat
 made fast to him and took him along side with 1
 fluke chain and hove for the night at 8 PM commen-
 ced cutting blowing equally as hard as before finished at 12
 as finished lost the head and on life so ends these
 24 hours

 all these 24 hours a strong breeze from the northward
 and Westward blowing to the Southward and Westward
 under short & still all hands Employed heeling and
 setting up sheets No Ends
