 the first part a strong breeze from the northward
 and Westward steering S by W to the forenoon
 topsail and one right Whales going quickly to wind
 ward to Ruggid to tow the middle part a strong
 gale from E by S looked the works and took in the
 foresail the latter part wind veered to S by E blowing
 strong also rainier over cast Weather at so moderate
 a little set the foresail and commenced boiling
 and setting up sheets to Ends Lat of Ob 44 30.5

 the first part a strong breeze from the northward and
 Westward steering to the southward and westward the
 middle part much the same the latter part moderate
 breeze from the northward and Westward steering E by S
 set Double Reefed top sail saw one Whale leaved
 and Chast finished boiling Employed stowing down
 oil sitting up sheets &c So Ends
 Lat of Ob 44 18

 the first part fresh breeze from the northward and
 Westward steering to southward and Westward saw Whales
 leaved and Chast middle part much the same the latter
 part strong breeze and moderate breeze from W by S down
 raine top sail and made sail saw Whales all hands
 Employed stowing down oil During the day
 Lat of Ob 44 22.5

New Zealand Cruising for Whales Hamland Smith Master
 Remarks onboard Wed March 31st 1841
 the first part a fresh breeze from W saw Whales
 leaved fastened and parted Employed stowing down oil
 the took in sail for the night more ship to the
 north the latter part a strong breeze from W by S
 set Double Reefed top sails and mainsail saw Whales
 to wind ward to Ruggid to tow Employed taking the
 thing from the upper and Caping &c So Ends
 Lat of Ob 44 24.5

Remarks onboard Thur April 1st 1841
 the first part a strong breeze from W by Night
 Whales right to windward leaved and Chast the
 middle part took in short for the night to stowing
 at the latter part the wind increased to a strong gale
 all hands Employed putting Cash Spoke &c from
 the upper Deck between decks and shaped our gear
 for home steering E at Double Reefed top sail So Ends
 Lat of Ob 44 36 1/2
 W. Noon. Long of Ob 179 20 1/2
