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The first part pleasant weather the middle and latter part cloudy overcast weather. the ship crew at liberty men from the shore breaking out oil during the day. so ends. and no further remarks to make

N. S. S. Course Winds way See Remarks on Board Monday May 10th 1841

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all the 24 hours pleasant men from shore breaking out oil the ships company ashore on liberty sent oil on shore &c so ends these 24 hours

N. S. S. Course Winds way See Remarks on Board Tuesday May 11th 1841

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All these 24 hours cloudy overcast weather some rain a moderate breeze from N. Men from shore breaking out oil the ships crew ashore on liberty sent 20 Cask of sperm oil on board of the Wilmington Liverpool Packett so ends these 24 hours

N. S. S. Course Winds way See Remarks on Board Wednesday May 12th 1841

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these 24 hours Commences with a strong breeze from the north and rainy overcast weather at 11 o'clock the wind increased to a strong gale had both anchor down and both chains paid out the ship dragged both anchor nearly on shore or in 3 fathom of water we sent down fore and main topgallant mast & main topgallant yard fore topsail yard and mizen so the ships company on shore on liberty and men from shore to take care of the ship at 7 A.M. the gale abated all hands went on board hove up the anchor and warped the ship off shore on safe ground no further remarks so. Ends.

N. S. S. Course Winds way See Remarks on Board Thursday May 13th 1841

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these 24 hours Commence with moderate breeze from the north all hands aboard and men from shore to work. sent down the fore topmast the mizen so the first part of the day the latter part breaking out oil sent ashore the fore yard the fore topsail yard and fore topgallant mast main topsail yard main topgallant yard & mast mizen topsail yard & the sails belonging to them also 2 spring boom 2 topgallant standing sail boom 2 topmast chidding sail boom sent on board the Wilmington Liverpool Packett 25 Cask & Keg. 7 Bbls of sperm oil so ends the 24 hours

N. S. S. Course Winds way See Remarks on Board Friday May 14th 1841

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All of these 24 hours very pleasant weather all of the ships company and men from shore breaking out oil landed 42 Cask of Whale oil on shore so ends these 24 hours
