

Remarks on board Saturday 4th 1830

all these twenty four hours strong gales and squally wind from the North at Meridian the wind shifted to the South and westward. at 4 P.M. came off from the shore, and made sail to clear the Island at Meridian the Island bore by Compass N.W. Dist 20 miles.

Remarks on board Sunday 5th 1830

strong gales all these twenty four hours, wind from the South & Westward at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship Lintin of Boston bound for Canton, fifty seven days out we felt her have some water. So Ends. Blowing heavy

Remarks on board Monday 6th 1830

these twenty four hours, blowing very heavy with a plenty of hail and rain took in the main top sail, and have too under main and mizen stay sails at 10 A.M. lost a cask of Oil of the Deck. So Ends.

Remarks on board Tuesday 7th 1830

first and middle part blowing heavy from the Westward latter part more moderate, the ship heading N.W. Dist by Compass 36-12 S Long by Astr. 10-30 West.

Remarks on board Wednesday 8th 1830

first and middle part moderate winds with a bad sea, latter part strong gales from the North & Westward So Ends Lying too under a clost reefed main top.

Remarks on board Thursday 9th 1830

first and middle part heavy gales from the North latter part more moderate made some sail So Ends Latt by Compass 36-30 Long by Astr. 9-00 West.

Remarks on board Friday 10th 1830

strong gales and rainy all these twenty four hours Lying under short sail.

Remarks on board Saturday 11th 1830

strong gales and rainy all these twenty four hours wind from N.W. until 2 P.M. it then shifted to the S.E. at Day Light made sail and kept off West. saw one Whale at meridian ~~and~~ the land bearing West. Dist 60 miles. So Ends Latt by Compass 36-30

Remarks on board Sunday 12th 1830

first part strong breezes from the Southward, and clear weather, Middle calm, latter part strong breezes from the North. So Ends. Lying too under short sail the Island bearing West. Dist thirty miles.

Remarks on board Monday 13th 1830

strong breezes and squally all these twenty four hours, wind from the Westward, Lying under short sail, one sail in sight to the Southward at Meridian the Island bore by Compass West, Dist. 60 miles.

Remarks on board Tuesday 14th 1830

strong gales and squally all these twenty four hours wind from the Westward. So Ends, still lying too, at Meridian the land bore by Compass N.W. Dist 70 miles.

Remarks on board Wednesday 15th 1830

strong gales, and squally and rainy all these twenty four hours wind from the North and Westward. Still lying too. So Ends. one man very sick. No B. Long by Astr. 11-00 West.

Remarks on board Thursday 16th 1830

first part strong gales and rainy, Middle and latter part light airs and calm at Daylight made sail one ship in sight to the Northward Latt by Compass 37-30 Long by Astr. 10-30 West.
