Saturday Jan 14

Begins with a moderate breeze from N by N. Ship steering E by S with all sail set Middle part wind N by E and fresh at 6 AM took in the light sails at 4 AM took two reefs in the top sails at 10 AM took in jib and main sail at 10 AM took in main sail and fore top sail a fresh gale from N by N ship by 2 1/2 E 3 AM men of duty nothing in sight

Sunday Jan 15

Begins with a gale from N by E with thick rain weather ship by the wind E by E under three reef main top sail and fore top mast stay sail at 4 PM wind cut W by W set sprit sail starboard E by E last part wind N by E with pleasant weather ship with all sail set saw nothing landmine on duty again

This day a fresh breeze from N by E with pleasant weather ship steering E by S with all sail set employed repairing a boat and other jobs about ship Mike still off duty with his eyes
