1865

Sunday May 14th

Begins with a fresh breeze from N
Ship head W by W with all sail set at 6
saw Right whales at 7 P.M. shortened sail
for the night at 8 A.M. were ship to E. by S
wind N saw nothing at 7 A.M. were ship to N
set all sail saw nothing Charles Hazard
Jeny off duty Bainbridge still off duty

Monday May 15th

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.W.
with squalls of snow at 2 P.M. saw
Kestoy Island bearing W dist about 20
miles at 5 P.M. Mexican Island at 7 30 P.M.
tacked to N.E. in Diane Straits at 11 P.M.
passed in to the Behatks Sea wind to the
northward ship on different tacks making
to the northward with all prudent sail
set the same three men off duty

Tuesday May 16th

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.W.
with pleasant weather ship by the wind
W by S with all sail set three islands
in sight to the S.E. middle part light
breeze last part moderate with some fog
from S steering N with all sail set
three islands in sight saw nothing
Jeny on duty again the other two off

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Wednesday May 17th

Begins with a moderate breeze from
S.E. with pleasant weather steering N
with all sail set at 3 P.M. shifted the main
top sail middle part wind S.E. with rain and
snow took in light sails last part strong
gale took in main sail took two reefs
in the fore top sail at 11 30 A.M. steered N.W.
Charles Hazard and Bainbridge off duty

Thursday May 18th

Begins with a fresh breeze from S.E.
with thick fog and snow steering
N.W. with all sail set middle part
moderate breeze from S.E. with thick fog
last part the same all sail set nothing
in sight Charles Hazard on duty again
so ends this day Bainbridge off duty

Long. do 150° 40' E

Friday May 19th

Begins with a moderate breeze from
E.W. with fog steering N.W. at 4 P.M.
wind N.E. by W steered N.W. by W with all
sail set middle and last part much the
same ship steering N.W. all sail set nothing
in sight Richard Bainbridge still off duty
