At Honolulu

Sunday Nov 17th

Begins with pleasant weather ship at anchor hands employed at different jobs about ship middle and last part much the same

Monday Nov 18th

Begins with pleasant weather from ship in port hands employed at various jobs about the ship so ends this day all well

Tuesday Nov 19th

Begins with fine pleasant weather ship at anchor at 6 A.M. took the pilot & tug and went in to Honolulu Harbor and made all snug so ends this day

Wednesday Nov 20th

Begins with showery weather ship at anchor last part much the same hands employed at different jobs about the ship took the anchor and went along side of the George Howland to discharge the oil so ends this day

Thursday Nov 21st

Begins with thick rainy weather ship at anchor employed striking oil and storing on board the Geo Howland so ends this day Long one of the seamen had stopped over his time and reported as done

Friday Nov 22nd

Begins with light showery weather employed discharging oil on board the Geo Howland making very slow work on account of the cask not fitting

Saturday Nov 23rd

Begins with very warm weather all hands employed storing oil on board the George Howland Jerry still absent so ends this day fine weather

Sunday Nov 24th

Begins with clear weather in the morning found we had a storeroom on board take him and his chest to the Hospital where he belonged all hands busy storing oil in the other ship Jerry still absent

Monday Nov 25th

Fine weather clear and pleasant all the 24 busy all hands busy storing down oil in the George Howland

Tuesday Nov 26th

Begins with clear hot weather and calm after breakfast the crew were furnished with money and all who wished went ashore - remainder of the day clear and calm

Wednesday Nov 27th

Begins with calm hot weather broke out the ground tier subdivided it to get out the scum and sent it on board the Geo Howland, received from her 28 fathoms 2 feet 3 inches of scum

Thursday Nov 28th

Begins with clear hot weather finished discharging oil having put on board of her 21 23 4 gals of oil leaving about 4 barrels in the ship

Friday Nov 29th

Begins with warm weather broke out for slop and provisions for the Commissary Howland have 170 pounds of butter and the Geo Howland 10 barrels pork 4 of beef 10 of flour 173 yds Pringle 40 yds Brown Cotton 52 yds Denim 18 striped Shirts 12 pair Semin Peony, let her have 6 1/2 " Brown Paint
