

Laying at Anchor in Honolulu

1865

Thursday Dec 30

Boeing with fair weather and light trade, cast off from the large Howland hauled to an anchor and moved ship, employed in setting up sheels for water casks, to day discharge Mr. Hoag by mutual consent of both parties

Friday Dec 31

Boeing with hot weather, in the morning found Alto Keller missing, at 10 he came off, he having been sent off by the Captain to go another anchor and moved ship

Saturday Dec 2

Boeing with clear warm weather, busy setting up water casks, to day the mess hall came on board and searched ship for dejecta, but did not find them

Sunday Dec 3

Boeing with baffling winds first off the land and then on with occasional calm showers, the crew were again provided with money and the went ashore with supplies, remainder of the day high trade, from N.E.

Monday Dec 4

Boeing with clear weather and a good breeze from N.E. all hands busy throughout the day setting up water casks

Tuesday Dec 5

Boeing with high trade, sent ashore a raft of water casks filled them and brought them on board to trim ship to get her head out of water to repair the copper

Wednesday Dec 6

Boeing with fair weather and high breeze from N.E. at work at her bow sent in another raft of casks and got it off making about 150 barrels of water so far

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Thursday Dec 7

Boeing with good weather, at an early hour found that our stern line had parted called all hands and secured it again finally repairing the copper and righted ship

Friday Dec 8

Boeing with thunder showing, after breakfast found Bernard Tage absent from the ship without permission during the day stowed down the water and commenced painting ship outside below the white struts

Saturday Dec 9

Boeing with calm sultry weather to day secured on board a permanent hand named George Emery a shipfitter, the Captain, also another anchor purchased when Bernard still absent

Sunday Dec 10

Boeing with calm warm weather the whole day went ashore and over afternoon supplied with money by the Captain, Bernard still absent and now virtually a dejecta from the ship

Monday Dec 11

Boeing with a dead calm at the ship about ready for sea at daylight when all hands were called found another man named Carr absent

Tuesday Dec 12

Boeing with clear warm weather and light variable air, when all hands were called found another absent Richard Bainbridge making 4 absent Bernard, Carr, Bainbridge and Jerry
