

Ship at Anchen at Lypar

1866

Monday Feb 5th

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.E. with squalls ship at anchor saw whales heard got nothing no chance whales do ends this day trying very hard

Tuesday Feb 6th

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.E. with pleasant weather ship at anchor saw whales heard no chance at 8 P.M. the Bark. Mer. of New Bedford came in to anchor and hence leaving Saint Francisco so ends this day

Wednesday Feb 7th

Begins with fresh breeze from N.E. to N.W. with pleasant weather ship at anchor middle and last part the same saw whales boats out got nothing no chance & so ends

Thursday Feb 8th

Begins with a strong wind from N.W. with passing squalls of rain ship at anchor employed at various jobs about ship saw whales no chance so ends this day

Friday Feb 9th

Begins with fresh wind from N.E. with pleasant weather employed painting the white waist and other jobs saw whales no chance middle and last part the same weather so ends this day

Saturday Feb 10th

Begins with a very strong breeze from N.E. with squalls of rain ship at anchor middle and last part the same saw whales heard no chance got nothing so ends this day dull

Ship at Lypar

Sunday Feb 11th

Begins with a strong wind from N.E. with squally weather ship at anchor middle and last part the same saw whales off shore no chance so ends this day

Monday Feb 12th

Begins with fresh breeze from N.E. with fine weather ship at anchor last part saw whales heard struck and killed one employed towing hip to the ship so ends this day

Tuesday Feb 13th

Begins with fine pleasant weather from 2 at 3 P.M. took the whale to the ship and cut the whale last part took the anchor board to Lynneer wind S.E. and light two boats off after whales got none

Wednesday Feb 14th

Begins with light cloudy weather from S.E. two boats off at 10 P.M. the ship dropped anchor at the above place in 13 fathoms of water gave the ship 45 fathoms of chain middle and last part heavy rain saw whales heard got nothing no chance

Thursday Feb 15th

Begins with a strong breeze from N.E. thick rainey weather ship at anchor employed bailing middle and last part the same last part saw whales heard two boats got nothing no chance

Friday Feb 16th

Begins with a strong wind from N.E. with squally weather ship at anchor employed bailing at 3 P.M. finished middle part the much the same last part took a raft of Cask on shore per water boats off per whales saw got nothing
