Begins with pleasant weather from N.E. middle and last part much the same ship at anchor hands employed about ship at various jobs so ends this day

Thursday March 6th

Begins with pleasant weather from N.E. ship at anchor middle part the same last part fresh breeze with squalls of rain one watch on shore the other employed about ship at different jobs

Friday March 7th

Begins with pleasant weather one watch on shore middle and last part the same the hands on board employed at various jobs about the ship

Saturday March 8th

Begins with squally weather one watch on shore middle and last part the same the watch returns the other watch on liberty have on board employed about the ship

Sunday March 9th

Begins with passing showers of rain middle and last part the same one watch on shore on liberty so ends this day

Monday March 10th

Begins stormy weather hands all on board employed at different jobs about the ship so ends this day all well

Tuesday March 6th

Begins with fresh breeze from S.W. with squalls ship at anchor all hands on board employed about ship at different jobs making ready for sea shipped two men Albert Winkler as Cook and Antone Roderie so ends this day at anchor

Wednesday March 7th

Begins with thick squally weather from the N.E. ship at anchor waiting for the weather to moderate and clear up middle and last part the same no change so ends this day all well

Thursday March 8th

Begins much the same rainier but moderate middle part the same last part fresh breeze from N.E. with rain at 4 P.M. took the Pilot boat anchorage steered out at 8 P.M. the pilot left ship by the wind with all prudent sail set the land dist 8 miles so ends today

Friday March 9th

Begins with a fresh breeze from S.W. and squally ship steering N. with all prudent sail set middle and last part the same employed at different jobs

Saturday March 10th

Begins with pleasant weather from S.W. steered N.W. all sail set hands employed at different jobs repairs and painting boats and other jobs about ship so ends this day
