

Ship at Anchor on the North Shore

1846

Tuesday June 5<sup>th</sup>

Begins with pleasant weather ship at anchor the two boats not yet returned at midday the Camp took fire and Joseph Silvia of St George one of the present boats crew was burnt to death last part pleasant weather on board employed mending and other jobs

Wednesday June 6<sup>th</sup>

Begins with pleasant weather ship at anchor middle part moderate but cloudy last part fresh from N.E. with light rain the boats still absent to ends this day seeing nothing

Thursday June 7<sup>th</sup>

Begins with moderate weather from the N.W. ship at anchor two boats up the bay hand on board employed at various jobs about 11<sup>th</sup>

Friday June 8<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light pleasant from the west employed getting a raft of water last part fresh gail from N.E. two boats get off

Saturday June 9<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh gail from N.E. with some fog middle and last part moderate from N. with thick fog the two not yet returned

Sunday June 10<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light pleasant weather from the eastward middle part the same last part wind from N.E. at 4 A.M. took anchor stand up the bay found heavy ice at 4.15 thick fog the two boats not yet returned

Monday June 11<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong wind from N.E. with thick fog at 5 P.M. came to anchor in 9 fathoms of water at 11 the two boats returned Jan mending at 6 A.M. took anchor stand up the bay round the

In South West Bay

Tuesday June 12<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light breeze from N.E. and pleasant at 8 P.M. came to anchor in N.E. harbour in 5 fathoms of water last part strong wind from E.N.E. hands employed cutting wood

Wednesday June 13<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh gail from E.S.W. all hands on board have the ship 45 fathoms of chain middle part thick and rainey latter part thick and foggy sent off lumber waist and bow boat for a long cruise

Thursday June 14<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fog and rain sent ashore the two starboard boat of a raft of wood middle part a gale of wind from N.E. let go the other anchor latter part the same with fog and rain

Friday June 15<sup>th</sup>

Begins with a gale of wind from N.E. with fog and rain middle part moderate a little and the ice coming down upon us latter part weather the same attempt to get under way to get out of the ice but were compelled to come to anchor again in 5 fathoms of water

Saturday June 16<sup>th</sup>

Begins with cloudy weather and light breeze from N.E. got under way at 9 P.M. came to anchor in Florence Harbour middle and latter part foggy and even light from the bay tower

Sunday June 17<sup>th</sup>

Begins with cloudy weather and calm middle and latter part calm and foggy

Monday June 18<sup>th</sup>

Begins with a thick fog and a calm middle and latter part foggy with light E.S.W. wind
