

In Florence Harbor

1866

Tuesday June 19

Boeing with a rain storm middle part clear and wind light from the W. later part light wind from S.W. the tow boat also came back they had seen an whale

Wednesday June 20

Boeing with clear calm weather got under way and came to anchor at 6 in N.E. harbor, middle part clear and calm, at 10 A.M. got under way the ice coming down on us, a thick fog also set in in 20 minutes the ship struck on the reef broadside and leaved then the tide falling

Thursday June 21

Boeing with clear weather and moderate wind from N.E. the ship nearly high and dry, the pintle of her rudder broken and about 12 feet of her false keel gone kept trying the pumps occasionally but found no water at 4.30 found plenty of water kept both pumps going and broke out for pumping at 5 she righted and floated below her boat and towed her in at 6 the pumps worked came to anchor middle part calm and foggy latter part the same day at the anchor trying to repair it temporarily

Friday June 22

Boeing with foggy weather and high breeze from the Eastward hung the anchor again middle part foggy with light air, at 5 A.M. sent the tow boat with provisions for the other boat

Saturday June 23

Boeing with good weather and light wind from N.E. the ship making only 240 strokes in 24 hours middle and latter part foggy with light E. S. E. wind

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Sunday June 24

Boeing with clear weather and light E. S. E. wind the ice coming down on the vessel and was compelled to let it go again middle and latter part clear and calm

Monday June 25

Boeing with clear pleasant weather and light E. S. E. wind middle and latter part the weather clear with light wind from W. S. W. the ship making now only 120 strokes in 24 hours

Tuesday June 26

Boeing with clear weather and light wind from the Eastward middle part clear and calm latter part low up the anchor and storm masts in show

Wednesday June 27

Boeing with good weather and fresh breeze from N.E. hove up the anchor and went to Pillsbury Harbor middle part the ship dragging let go the other anchor, latter part hove up the starboard and fore it put the weather foggy and wind moderate from the W. S. W. got under way standing across toward Bear Island

Thursday June 28

Boeing with a thick fog and light wind from the Westward at 6.30 the Caribian boat came to the ship after an absence of 15 days they had seen 12 or 15 whales middle part the same, latter part came to anchor off Horse Shoe Bay

Friday June 29

Boeing with clear weather and moderate wind from S. S. W. the ship now nearly as tight as ever she was middle part fine weather and light happing wind latter part fresh breeze from S.E. with considerable ice in sight
